PUBLIC MEETINGS: Provides for an exception to the Open Meetings Law

1 AN ACT 2 To enact R.S. 42:17(E), relative to meetings of public bodies; to provide for an exception to 3 requirements regarding meetings of public bodies; to provide relative to certain 4 meetings via telecommunications media; to provide for an effective date; and to 5 provide for related matters. 6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 7 Section 1. R.S. 42:17(E) is hereby enacted to read as follows: 8 §17. Exceptions to open meetings 9 10 E. The provisions of this Chapter shall not apply to conference calls or other 11 conversations via telecommunication media at which presentations to members of 12 the public body are the only purpose of the call and no vote or other action, including 13 formal or informal polling of members, is taken. 14 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 15 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 16 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 17 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 18 effective on the day following such approval.

Abstract: Exempts certain conference calls from the requirements of the Open Meetings Law.

<u>Present law</u> requires that all meetings of public bodies be open to the public. Provides relative to public notice of such meeting, public comment and voting during meetings, and publication of minutes of meetings.

<u>Present law</u> defines meeting as a convening of a quorum of a public body to receive information, deliberate, or act on a matter over which the public body has supervision, control, jurisdiction, or advisory power.

<u>Present law</u> excepts certain meetings from the requirements of <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides an additional exception. Provides that <u>present law</u> does not apply to conference calls and other conversations via telecommunication media at which presentations are the only purpose of the meeting and no vote or other action, including formal or informal polling of members, is taken.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
