CRIMINAL/SENTENCING: Provides relative to pleas of guilty or nolo contendere in felony cases

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact Code of Criminal Procedure Article 556.1(C) and to enact Code of
3	Criminal Procedure Article 556.1(A)(5), relative to pleas in criminal cases; to
4	provide relative to pleas of guilty or nolo contendere in felony cases; to provide
5	relative to duties of the court or defense counsel; to require the court or defense
6	counsel to inform a defendant of additional consequences as a result of a guilty plea
7	or nolo contendere; to require the court to inquire of the defendant or defense counsel
8	of plea offers made by the state; and to provide for related matters.
9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
10	Section 1. Code of Criminal Procedure Article 556.1(C) is hereby amended and
11	reenacted and Code of Criminal Procedure Article 556.1(A)(5) is hereby enacted to read as
12	follows:
13	Art. 556.1. Plea of guilty or nolo contendere in felony cases; duty duties of the court
14	and defense counsel
15	A. In a felony case, the court shall not accept a plea of guilty or nolo
16	contendere without first addressing the defendant personally in open court and
17	informing him of, and determining that he understands, all of the following:

1	(5) That if he pleads guilty or nolo contendere, he may be subject to
2	additional consequences in the following areas as a result of this plea, for which
3	defense counsel or the court shall inform him:
4	(a) Potential deportation, for a person who is not a United States citizen.
5	(b) Voting rights.
6	(c) Possession of a firearm.
7	(d) Subsidized housing.
8	(e) Issuance of licenses.
9	(f) College admissions and financial aid.
10	(g) Potential sentencing as a habitual offender.
11	(h) Standard of proof for probation or parole revocations.
12	* * *
13	C.(1) The court shall also inquire as to whether the defendant's willingness
14	to plead guilty or nolo contendere results from prior discussions between the district
15	attorney and the defendant or his attorney. If a plea agreement has been reached by
16	the parties, the court, on the record, shall require the disclosure of the agreement in
17	open court or, on a showing of good cause, in camera, at the time the plea is offered.
18	(2) The court shall further inquire of the defendant or his attorney whether
19	the defendant has been informed of all plea offers made by the state.

Abstract: Provides relative to the duties of the court and defense counsel when a defendant pleads guilty or nolo contendere in felony cases.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the court shall not accept a plea of guilty or nolo contendere without first addressing the defendant personally in open court and informing him of, and determining that he understands, certain things including but not limited to: the nature of the charges against him and the penalties for such offense; that he has a right to be represented by an attorney at every stage of the proceeding against him; and that if he pleads guilty or nolo contendere, he waives his right to a trial.

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CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the defendant may be subject to additional consequences in the following areas as a result of his plea of guilty or nolo contendere, for which defense counsel or the court is required to inform him:

- (1) Potential deportation, for a person who is not a U.S. citizen.
- (2) Voting rights.
- (3) Possession of a firearm.
- (4) Subsidized housing.
- (5) Issuance of licenses.
- (6) College admissions and financial aid.
- (7) Potential sentencing as a habitual offender.
- (8) Standard of proof for probation or parole revocations.

<u>Present law</u> requires the court to inquire as to whether the defendant's willingness to plead guilty or nolo contendere results from prior discussions between the district attorney and the defendant or his attorney. <u>Present law</u> further requires the disclosure of the agreement in open court or, on a showing of good cause, in camera, at the time the plea is offered.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the court to inquire of the defendant or his attorney whether he has been informed of all plea offers made by the state.
