HOUSE BILL NO. 381

CIVIL SERVICE/FIRE & POL: Provides relative to members of municipal fire and police civil service boards

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 33:2476(B) and 2536(B), relative to municipal fire and police
3	civil service boards; to remove residency requirements for certain board members;
4	and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 33:2476(B) and 2536(B) are hereby amended and reenacted to read
7	as follows:
8	§2476. Municipal fire and police civil service boards
9	* * *
10	B.(1)(a) To be eligible for appointment or to serve as a member of a board,
11	a person shall be a citizen of the United States of America, a resident of the
12	municipality in which he is to serve for at least five years next preceding his
13	appointment, and, at the time of his appointment, shall be a qualified voter of the
14	municipality.
15	(b) However, with respect to the two members elected from the municipal
16	fire and the municipal police departments, such members shall be residents of the
17	parish in which the municipality they are to serve is located for a period of at least
18	five years preceding their appointment upon adoption of resolution so permitting
19	residence location by the local governing authority.

1	(c)(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subparagraphs (a) and (b)
2	Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph, the two members elected from the municipal fire
3	and the municipal police departments shall not be required to be residents or
4	qualified voters of the municipality in which they are appointed to serve or residents
5	of the parish in which the municipality is located provided that such exceptions are
6	approved by resolution of the local governing authority.
7	(d)(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subparagraph (b) of this Paragraph,
8	only one member shall be elected from the city of New Iberia municipal fire and
9	police civil service system in accordance with Paragraph (C)(4) of this Section,
10	provided that such exception is approved by resolution of the city of New Iberia
11	governing authority.

15	B.(1)(a) To be eligible for appointment or to serve as a member of a board,
16	a person shall be a citizen of the United States of America, a resident of the area for
17	which fire or police protection is provided for at least five years next preceding his
18	appointment, and at the time of his appointment a qualified voter of the area.
19	(b) However, with respect to the two members elected by and from the fire
20	and the police departments as provided in Paragraph (C)(3) of this Section, such
21	members shall have been residents of the parish in which the area they are to serve
22	is located for a period of at least five years preceding their appointment, provided
23	such residence requirement is approved by resolution of the local governing
24	authority.
25	(c)(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subparagraphs (a) and (b)
26	Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph, the two members elected by and from the fire
27	and the police departments as provided in Paragraph (C)(3) of this Section shall not
28	be required to be residents or qualified voters of the area in which they are appointed

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1 to serve or residents of the parish in which the area is located provided that such

exceptions are approved by resolution of the local governing authority.

Abstract: Relative to fire and police employee members of municipal fire and police civil service boards, removes certain residency requirements.

<u>Present constitution</u> creates a fire and police civil service system applicable to municipalities of over 13,000 in population and parishes and fire protection districts. Provides that the system is subject to Art. XIV, §15.1 of the 1921 constitution made statutory by the 1974 constitution.

<u>Present law</u> creates and provides for two fire and police civil service systems: (1) one applicable to any municipality which operates paid police and fire departments and which has a population of not fewer than 13,000 persons; and (2) one applicable to any parish, fire protection district, or municipality with a population of fewer than 13,000, but not fewer than 7,000 persons.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present constitution</u> and <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u>, relative to both systems, provides that a municipal fire and police civil service board is created in the municipal and parish government as well as certain fire protection districts. Provides that the board shall be composed of five members who are required to serve without compensation. Requires that each member of the board be a citizen of the U.S. and a resident of the area for which fire or police protection is provided for at least five years preceding his appointment. Additionally requires each member to be a qualified voter of the area at the time of his appointment.

Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Present law</u> requires that at least two members of the board be appointed who shall be first nominated and elected by and from the regular employees of the fire and police departments. Provides that these members shall be residents of the parish in which they serve for a period of at least five years preceding their appointment to the board, if so permitted by a resolution of the local governing authority. <u>Proposed law</u> removes the residency requirement.

<u>Present law</u> additionally provides that the two members elected from the regular employees of the fire and police department are not required to be or residents of the municipality or area or of the parish in which the municipality or area is located, if so permitted by a resolution of the local governing authority. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>.
