STUDENT/SCH ATTENDANCE: Provides relative to children exempted from the compulsory school attendance law

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 17:226(A), relative to exemptions from compulsory school
3	attendance; to remove exemption for certain children deemed unable to perform
4	school duties or profit from school experience; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 17:226(A) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
7	§226. Exemptions from compulsory attendance
8	A. The following classes of children provided for in this Section who are
9	temporarily excused from school shall be exempted from the provisions of this
10	Subpart:
11	(1) Children mentally, physically, or emotionally incapacitated to perform
12	school duties, and children unable to profit from further school experience, such
13	exemptions to be certified in writing by a psychiatrist, psychologist, recognized
14	evaluation center or clinic, or other professionally qualified person or agency
15	designated by the city, parish, or other local public school board.
16	(2) Children temporarily excused from school, as follows:
17	(a) Children who are personally ill and whose attendance in school would
18	endanger their own health or that of their classmates, each city, parish, or other local
19	public school board being hereby authorized to adopt and promulgate or publish such
20	resolutions as may seem wise and proper regarding the requirement of a certificate

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1 from a physician or nurse practitioner licensed to practice in the state in 2 substantiation of the absence of children under this authorization of temporary 3 absence.

(b) (2) Children in whose families there is serious illness which would
reasonably necessitate the absence from school if, in the judgment of the visiting
teacher or supervisor of child welfare and attendance, such absence is justified, or
if the illness is substantiated in writing by a physician or nurse practitioner licensed
to practice in the state.

9 (c) (3) Children in whose immediate family a death has occurred, such
10 absence not to exceed one week because of and at the time of such death.

- (d) (4) Children whose religious faith requires absence for the observance
 of special and recognized holidays of the child's own faith.
- 13 (e)(i) (5)(a) A child whose parent is a member of the United States Armed 14 Forces or the National Guard of a state and such parent has been called to duty for 15 or is on leave from overseas deployment to a combat zone or combat support posting 16 shall be granted excused absences, not to exceed five school days per school year, 17 for the day or days missed from school for the child to visit with his parent prior to 18 the parent's deployment or during the parent's leave and, upon returning to school, 19 shall be permitted to complete all class assignments, including all tests, missed while 20 the child was absent pursuant to the provisions of this Item. 21 (ii) (b) For the purposes of this Subparagraph, Paragraph, the term "parent"

Abstract: Deletes exemption from compulsory school attendance laws for children deemed to be mentally, physically, or emotionally unable to perform school duties or unable to profit from school experience.

CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

<u>Present law</u> exempts certain children from provisions of state law relative to school attendance, including children mentally, physically, or emotionally incapacitated to perform school duties and children unable to profit from further school experience, as certified by a psychiatrist, psychologist, recognized evaluation center or clinic, or other professionally qualified person or agency. <u>Proposed law</u> deletes this exemption.
