CIVIL SERVICE/FIRE & POL: (Constitutional Amendment) Removes the Baton Rouge Police Department from the municipal fire and police civil service system

A JOINT RESOLUTION

## 2 Proposing to amend Article X, Sections 16 and 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana, to 3 provide relative to municipal fire and police civil service; to remove the Baton 4 Rouge police department from the system; to provide for submission of the proposed 5 amendment to the electors; and to provide for related matters. 6 Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members 7 elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state of 8 Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to 9 amend Article X, Sections 16 and 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows: 10 §16. Establishment of System 11 Section 16. A system of classified fire and police civil service is created and 12 established. It Except as otherwise provided by this Part, it shall apply to all 13 municipalities having a population exceeding thirteen thousand and operating a 14 regularly paid fire and municipal police department and to all parishes and fire 15 protection districts operating a regularly paid fire department. 16 17 §18. Prior Provisions 18 Section 18.(A) Except as inconsistent with this Part, the provisions of Article 19 XIV, Section 15.1 of the Constitution of 1921 are retained and continued in force and effect as statutes. By law enacted by two-thirds of the elected members of each 20

house, the legislature may amend or otherwise modify any of those provisions, but
it may not abolish the system of classified civil service for such firemen and
municipal policemen or make the system inapplicable to any municipality having a
population exceeding thirteen thousand according to the latest decennial federal
census or to any parish or fire protection district operating a regularly paid fire
department. However, in a municipality having a population exceeding four hundred
thousand, paid firemen and municipal policemen shall be included if a majority of
the electors therein voting at an election held for that purpose approve their
inclusion. Such an election shall be called by the governing authority of the affected
city within one year after the effective date of this constitution.
(B) The provisions of Article XIV, Section 15.1 of the Constitution of 1921
are not applicable to the Baton Rouge police department. The legislature shall enact
no law providing for inclusion of the Baton Rouge police department in a civil
service system that includes other police departments.
Section 2. Be it further resolved that this proposed amendment shall be submitted
to the electors of the state of Louisiana at the statewide election to be held on November 5,
2024.
Section 3. Be it further resolved that on the official ballot to be used at the election,
there shall be printed a proposition, upon which the electors of the state shall be permitted
to vote YES or NO, to amend the Constitution of Louisiana, which proposition shall read as
follows:
Do you support an amendment to remove the Baton Rouge police department
from the municipal fire and police civil service system? (Amends Article X,
Sections 16 and 18)

**Abstract:** Removes the Baton Rouge police department from the municipal fire and police civil service system.

<u>Present constitution</u> creates a system of classified fire and police civil service for all municipalities having a population exceeding 13,000 and operating a regularly paid fire and municipal police department and to all parishes and fire protection districts operating a regularly paid fire department.

<u>Present constitution</u> retains as statutes provisions of the 1921 Constitution of La. applicable to the municipal fire and police civil service. Authorizes the legislature, by law enacted by two-thirds of the elected members of each house, to amend those provisions but prohibits the legislature from abolishing the system or making the system inapplicable to any municipality having a population exceeding 13,000 or to any parish or fire protection district operating a regularly paid fire department.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> provides that the provisions of the 1921 Constitution of La. are not applicable to the Baton Rouge police department. Prohibits the legislature from enacting a law providing for inclusion of the Baton Rouge police department in a civil service system that includes other police departments.

Provides for submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held November 5, 2024.
