HEALTH/MEDICAL TREATMENT: Provides relative to a patient's rights to certain medical treatments

AN ACT

2 To enact Subpart E of Part IV of Subchapter A of Chapter 5-D of Title 40 of the Louisiana 3 Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 40:1177.1, relative to patients' 4 rights; to provide for those with medical power of attorney; to provide for emergency 5 privilege; to provide access to a physician for the administration of medication; to 6 limit hospital liability; and to provide for related matters. 7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 8 Section 1. Subpart E of Part IV of Subchapter A of Chapter 5-D of Title 40 of the 9 Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of 40:1177.1, is hereby enacted to read as 10 follows: 11 SUBPART E. RIGHT TO MEDICATION ACCESS BY HOSPITAL PATIENTS 12 §1177.1. Request for medication; emergency privilege 13 A. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, any person with 14 medical power of attorney who requests a hospital staff member to administer any 15 particular medication shall be granted emergency privilege and access to a physician 16 within twenty-four hours of the request for the sole and limited purpose of 17 administering the requested medication. 18 B. Any hospital that acts in accordance with the provisions of Subsection A 19 of this Section shall not be held liable for any harm to a patient resulting from the administration of the requested medication. 20

Abstract: Grants emergency privilege and access to a physician when any person with medical power of attorney requests the administration of certain medications and limits hospital liability.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that any person with medical power of attorney who requests a hospital staff member to administer any particular medication shall be granted emergency privilege and access to a physician.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that access to a physician be provided within 24 hours of the request for the administration of medication.

<u>Proposed law</u> states that the physician shall be requested for the sole and limited purpose of administering the requested medication.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that hospitals that act in accordance with provisions of <u>proposed law</u> shall not be held liable for any harm to a patient resulting from the administration of the requested medication.
