# PROPERTY/RIGHTS: Provides for the ownership of monetary compensation from the sequestration of carbon

1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 9:1103, relative to carbon sequestration; to provide for ownership of
3	compensation from certain carbon sequestration; to provide for exceptions; and to
4	provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 9:1103 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	<u>§1103.</u> Carbon sequestration on surface or water bottom
8	Any monetary compensation derived for the sequestration of carbon on the
9	surface of land or water bottoms through biological processes, including but not
10	limited to the growth of plants or animals or other natural or induced processes, is
11	the property of the owner of the land or water bottom upon which such sequestration
12	occurs unless contractually assigned to another party.

Abstract: Provides that the owner of the land or water bottom is the owner of any monetary compensation derived from carbon sequestration.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the owner of the land or water bottom is the owner of any monetary compensation derived from the land or water bottom through carbon sequestration.
