TRAFFIC/VIOLATIONS: Requires voter approval prior to the imposition of civil fines for traffic violations based on evidence captured by automated traffic enforcement systems

1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 32:239, relative to traffic violations; to require voter approval prior to the
3	imposition of civil fines for violations based on evidence captured by automated
4	traffic enforcement systems; to provide relative to existing fines imposed based on
5	such evidence; and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 32:239 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
8	<u>§239. Traffic violations; civil fines; automated traffic enforcement systems</u>
9	A. No governing authority of a local governmental subdivision may impose
10	a civil fine for a violation of any traffic law, ordinance, rule, or regulation if the sole
11	evidence of such a violation is that captured by an automated traffic enforcement
12	system unless the imposition of such fines based on such evidence has been
13	authorized by a majority of the voters of the local governmental subdivision voting
14	on a proposition authorizing such actions at an election held for this purpose in
15	accordance with the Louisiana Election Code.
16	B. Any governing authority of a local governmental subdivision that, prior
17	to the effective date of this Section, has provided for the imposition of civil fines for
18	violations of traffic laws, ordinances, rules, or regulations based on evidence
19	captured by automated traffic enforcement systems may continue to impose such

1	fines until July 1, 2015. On and after July 1, 2015, the governing authority may
2	impose such civil fines only if authorized in accordance with Subsection A of this
3	Section.
4	C. For purposes of this Section, the term "automated traffic enforcement
5	system" means a camera or optical device erected along or above a public road,
6	street, or highway or attached to the outside of a parked vehicle and designed to work
7	in conjunction with a traffic control signal or radar speed detection equipment, or
8	both, and designed to photographically record images of the license plate or other
9	identifying feature of a motor vehicle that is operated in violation of law, ordinance,
10	rule, or regulation.
11	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
12	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
13	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
14	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
15	effective on the day following such approval.

**Abstract:** Requires voter approval before the governing authority of a parish or municipality may impose a civil fine for a traffic violation based on evidence captured by an automated traffic enforcement system.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits the governing authority of a parish or municipality from imposing a civil fine for a violation of any traffic law, ordinance, rule, or regulation based on evidence captured by an automated traffic enforcement system, unless the imposition of civil fines has been authorized by the voters.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes any governing authority that has imposed such civil fines prior to the effective date of <u>proposed law</u> to continue to do so until July 1, 2015, without an election.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
