## HEALTH: Restructures the Health Education Authority of La.

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 17:3051, 3052(1) through (3), and 3053 and to repeal R.S.
3	17:3052(4) through (9) and 3055(6) through (10), relative to the Health Education
4	Authority of Louisiana; to provide relative to the purposes and functions of the
5	authority; to provide for the membership of the authority and their selection; to
6	provide for the powers of the authority; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 17:3051, 3052(1) through (3), and 3053 are hereby amended and
9	reenacted as follows:
10	§3051. Statement of purpose and function
11	<u>A.</u> In order to promote the medical and health educational activities of
12	various public and private institutions and organizations in the state of Louisiana and
13	to promote health and welfare of its citizens through encouraging and assisting in the
14	provision of medical care and prompt and efficient health and health related services
15	at reasonable cost by public and private institutions and organizations in modern,
16	well-equipped facilities, and to strive to achieve superlative standards of attainment
17	in health care and education that will place Louisiana in the position of regional,
18	national, and international leadership in those fields, it is hereby declared to be in the
19	public interest that the Health Education Authority of Louisiana be created within the
20	Department of Health and Hospitals.

1	$\underline{B}$ . The purposes and functions of the authority are:
2	(1) To operate, in accordance with a master plan, a cooperative and
3	coordinated multi-institutional complex that will serve to attract, encourage and
4	assist public and private institutions and organizations that are dedicated to
5	exemplary patient care, health science education and biomedical research, as well as
6	organizations providing facilities and/or services deemed appropriate by the
7	authority, to locate and/or operate in a functional geographic relationship with said
8	complex. To create a cooperative and coordinated multi-institutional program that
9	will serve to attract, encourage, and assist public and private institutions and
10	organizations that are dedicated to exemplary patient care, health science education,
11	and biomedical research, as well as organizations providing facilities and services
12	considered appropriate by the authority. The location and operation shall be in a
13	functional geographic relationship by a system of three designated regions of
14	Louisiana as follows:
15	(a) The northern region consisting of the Shreveport, Monroe, and
16	Alexandria Health Service Planning Region, as designated by the Louisiana Regional
17	Medical Program in 1969.
18	(b) The central region consisting of the Baton Rouge, Lafayette, and Lake
19	Charles Health Service Planning Region, as designated by the Louisiana Regional
20	Medical Program in 1969.
21	(c) The southern region consisting of the New Orleans and Bayou-River
22	Health Planning Region, as designated by the Louisiana Regional Medical Program
23	<u>in 1969.</u>
24	(2) To aid in the development of health care and education programs by the
25	primary and participating institutions and to assist in the coordination of planning
26	and in implementing the attainment of the objectives of such institutions. To provide
27	each region with a university medical center for decentralization and redistribution
28	of health care services and health education facilities in terms of meaningful
29	aggregates of people as follows:

1	(a) To charge the medical school located at the Louisiana State University
2	Health Sciences Center-Shreveport with responsibility for the northern region. The
3	dean of the medical school and university hospital administrator shall report to the
4	chancellor of the Louisiana State University in Shreveport.
5	(b) To charge the medical center to be developed at Louisiana State
6	University in Baton Rouge with responsibility for the central region. The dean of the
7	medical school and university hospital administrator shall report to the chancellor of
8	Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge. The Louisiana State University Board
9	of Supervisors is hereby urged to:
10	(i) Phase-out and relocate the medical school located at the Louisiana State
11	University Health Sciences Center-New Orleans for assignment to the central region
12	for the common good of Louisiana citizens and to end duplicate medical education
13	facilities.
14	(ii) Combine the basic medical science resources and faculties of the medical
15	school located at the Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center-New
16	Orleans and the Louisiana State University School of Veterinary Medicine in the
17	central region to serve each for the common good and without duplication.
18	(iii) Relocate the Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center-New
19	Orleans library from New Orleans to the Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge.
20	(c) To provide to the University of Louisiana at Lafayette as a participating
21	educational institution of the central region the following programs:
22	(i) An institute for the gifted and talented child.
23	(ii) An institute for children's behavioral and psychological study.
24	(d) To provide for a children's hospital and medical center at the current site
25	of the University Medical Center at Lafayette. The physician services for the
26	children's hospital shall be provided by the medical school operated by Louisiana
27	State University to be located in Baton Rouge. Nursing and other allied health
28	services shall be provided by the University of Louisiana at Lafayette.

1	(e) To charge the Tulane University Medical Center with responsibility for
2	the southern region by providing plans and mechanisms wherein other greater New
3	Orleans colleges and universities in the southern region can participate in the various
4	health sciences programs.
5	(f) To charge Tulane University with management, by contract, of the
6	Medical Center of Louisiana at New Orleans, the Interim Public Hospital, and its
7	replacement facility and to operate this facility as an urban community hospital with
8	open medical staff privileges and also as a communicable and tropical diseases
9	institute for the public domain.
10	(g) To urge and direct the Louisiana State University Board of Supervisors
11	to transfer the nursing school and allied health professions located at the Louisiana
12	State University Health Science Center-New Orleans with all its properties to the
13	University of New Orleans. All vacant buildings shall be transferred to the
14	University of New Orleans.
15	(h) To provide for the Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center
16	School of Dentistry and its facility.
17	(i) To provide, by contract, with the Orleans Parish Medical Society and with
18	Tulane University, for the use of their combined Medical-Health Sciences library,
19	housed in the Tulane University Medical Center, as the Medical-Health Sciences
20	library for all southern region institutions.
21	(3) To acquire or assist in the acquisition of land and the planning,
22	acquisition, construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, improvement and
23	development of facilities in the complex and primary service area for the use of the
24	primary and participating institutions, and the development, acquisition,
25	construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, improvement and operation of jointly
26	usable facilities for such institutions, and To provide that plans and mechanisms in
27	all public and private colleges and universities, and other educational institutions
28	located in a designated region, shall participate in various allied health educational
29	programs.

1	(4) To assist in or provide for the financing of any of the above and
2	foregoing activities or facilities in the manner hereinafter authorized.
3	§3052. Definitions Functions
4	The following terms shall have the following meanings, unless the context
5	clearly indicates otherwise: The Health Education Authority of Louisiana shall have
6	the following functions:
7	(1) "Act" shall mean Act 112 of the Regular Session of the Legislature of
8	Louisiana for the year 1968, as amended, which Act as so amended now appears as
9	La.R.S. 17:3051 to La.R.S. 17:3060, inclusive, and all future acts supplemental
10	thereto or amendatory thereof. Aiding in the development of health care and
11	education programs by participating institutions and assisting in the coordination of
12	planning and implementing the attainment of the objectives of these institutions.
13	(2) "Authority" shall mean the Health Education Authority of Louisiana, and
14	when used in connection with action authorized to be taken by the authority, shall
15	mean the authority acting by and through its board of trustees. Acquiring land or
16	assisting in the acquisition of land, and the planning, acquisition, construction,
17	reconstruction, rehabilitation, improvement, and development of facilities in a given
18	region.
19	(3) "Board" shall mean the board of trustees of the Health Education
20	Authority of Louisiana. Assisting in or providing for the financing of any of the
21	activities or facilities specified in this Section in the manner hereinafter authorized.
22	§3053. Health Education Authority of Louisiana; creation; domicile; membership;
23	terms; vacancies; quorum; staff
24	A. There is hereby created in the office of management and finance of the
25	Department of Health and Hospitals the Health Education Authority of Louisiana,
26	which is hereby declared to be a body corporate and public, constituting an
27	instrumentality of the state of Louisiana and exercising public and essential
28	governmental functions. The domicile of the authority shall be in the city of New
29	Orleans Baton Rouge.

1	B. The power to establish policy to carry out the intent of this Chapter shall
2	be vested in a board of trustees which shall consist of the governor as ex-officio
3	trustee and thirteen persons selected as follows:
4	(1) Two members shall be appointed by the governor from a list of six names
5	submitted by the Board of Supervisors of Louisiana State University and
6	Agricultural and Mechanical College. One member shall be appointed by the
7	governor from the state at large.
8	(2) Two members shall be appointed by the governor from a list of six names
9	submitted by the Board of Administrators of the Tulane Educational Fund, Tulane
10	University of Louisiana. Four members appointed by the governor from the northern
11	region, including one physician each from Shreveport, Monroe, and Alexandria.
12	(3) Two members shall be appointed by the governor from a list of six names
13	submitted by the Board of Administrators of Charity Hospital of Louisiana at New
14	Orleans. Four members appointed by the governor from the central region, including
15	one physician each from Baton Rouge, Lafayette, and Lake Charles.
16	(4) Two members shall be appointed by the governor from a list of six names
17	submitted by the Executive Board of the Louisiana State Medical Society. Four
18	members appointed by the governor from the southern region, including one
19	physician from New Orleans and two from the Bayou-River Health Planning Region,
20	as designated by the Louisiana Regional Medical Program in 1969.
21	(5) One member shall be appointed by the governor from a list of six names
22	submitted by the statewide dental associations.
23	(6) One member shall be appointed by the mayor of the city of New Orleans
24	with the advice and consent of the Commission Council from a list of five names,
25	one each submitted by the Board of Administrators of the Tulane Educational Fund,
26	Tulane University of Louisiana; the Board of Administrators of Charity Hospital of
27	Louisiana at New Orleans; the Board of Supervisors of Louisiana State University
28	and Agricultural and Mechanical College; local dental association memberships
29	including Orleans Parish dentists; and the Orleans Parish Medical Society.

1	(7) Three members shall be appointed by the governor from the state at
2	<del>large.</del>
3	C. No person appointed directly by the governor or mayor or nominated by
4	any of the nominating groups or individuals shall be associated in any staff or
5	advisory capacity for which he receives payment for services from Louisiana State
6	University and Agricultural and Mechanical College Board of Supervisors and its
7	institutions, colleges, and universities, Tulane University of Louisiana, or Charity
8	Hospital of Louisiana at New Orleans Medical Center of Louisiana at New Orleans,
9	any statewide dental association, or the Louisiana State Medical Society.
10	D. Each appointment by the governor shall be submitted to the Senate for
11	confirmation.
12	E. Members of the board who are appointed by the governor shall serve at
13	the pleasure of the governor. The member appointed by the mayor of New Orleans
14	shall serve a term of six years.
15	F. A vacancy occurring on the board for any reason shall be filled in the
16	same manner as the original appointment.
17	G. The board shall employ a professionally qualified executive director to
18	carry out the policies established by the board. The secretary of the Department of
19	Health and Hospitals shall employ such staff as is necessary to carry out the policies
20	and directives of the board and to operate and administer the functions of the
21	authority. The compensation of the executive director shall be determined by the
22	board and he shall be in the unclassified service of the state.
23	Section 2. R.S. 17:3052(4) through (9) and 3055(6) through (10) are hereby repealed
24	in their entirety.

HB No. 507

Abstract: Restructures and provides with respect to the powers of the Health Education Authority of La.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the purposes and functions of the Health Education Authority of La. (HEAL) are:

- (1) To operate, in accordance with a master plan, a multi-institution complex of health care facilities.
- (2) To aid in the development of health care and education programs.
- (3) To acquire or assist in the acquisition of jointly usable facilities.
- (4) To assist or provide financing.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that HEAL's purposes are:

- (1) To create a multi-institutional health care complex by providing for facilities in three regions.
- (2) To provide each region with a university medical center for decentralization of health care services by charging various existing medical institutions with providing services in three regions: northern, central, and southern; granting certain programs to certain institutions; urging that medical facilities be relocated; and providing for plans for universities and colleges to participate in allied health services education programs.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that HEAL's functions are to aid in the development of health care and education programs; to acquire or assist in the acquisition of land; to assist in financing.

<u>Present law</u> provides for a 13-member board to serve for staggered terms, with nine of the members being appointed by the governor from lists submitted by various medical institutions or societies, three members being appointed by the governor at large, and one member being appointed by the mayor of New Orleans.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that 13 members be appointed by the governor, four from each of the three regions as provided for in <u>proposed law</u>, and one from the state at large, all to serve at the pleasure of the governor.

Proposed law changes the domicile of the authority from New Orleans to Baton Rouge.

<u>Proposed law</u> repeals the authority of HEAL to acquire immovable property, to manage real property, to borrow money, to formulate a master plan, or to construct or manage hospitals.
