1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 47:305.66, relative to state sales and use tax; to authorize an exemption from
3	state sales and use tax for the purchase of certain motor vehicles which have been or
4	will be modified for use by a person with an orthopedic disability; to provide for
5	requirements and limitations; to authorize the payment of rebates; to authorize
6	rulemaking; to provide for applicability and an effective date; and to provide for
7	related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 47:305.66 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
10	§305.66. Exemption; motor vehicles for use by persons with orthopedic disabilities
11	A. Effective from January 1, 2010, through June 30, 2013, the sales and use
12	tax imposed by the state of Louisiana and its political subdivisions whose boundaries
13	are coterminous with the state shall not apply to the purchase of a motor vehicle by
14	an individual that has been or will be modified for operation by, or for the
15	transportation of, a person who is permanently orthopedically disabled at the time
16	of purchase, and which is primarily driven by or used for the transportation of such
17	person. The modifications shall be made in accordance with a prescription issued
18	for the person by a physician, a licensed chiropractor, or a driver rehabilitation
19	specialist licensed by the state. For purposes of this Section, the term "motor
20	vehicle" shall not include vehicles purchased for resale or lease, or vehicles used for
21	non-personal, business, or commercial purposes, including ambulances, or travel
22	trailers or other vehicles not designed to transport people.
23	B.(1) As used in this Section, "orthopedically disabled" means a person who
24	has permanent, limited movement of body extremities and loss of physical functions.

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CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

1	The physical impairment shall be such that the person is either unable to operate or
2	be transported in a reasonable manner in a motor vehicle that has not been specially
3	modified.
4	(2) Modifications of a vehicle for the purpose of transporting an
5	orthopedically disabled person shall include installation of such items as a
6	wheelchair lift, hoist, attached ramp, wheelchair hold-down clamps, or special seat
7	restraints other than conventional seat belts to allow for the transportation of an
8	orthopedically disabled person in a reasonable manner.
9	(3) Modifications of a vehicle for operation by an orthopedically disabled
10	person shall include altering such items as the conventional brake, acceleration, or
11	steering systems to facilitate the operation of the vehicle by an orthopedically
12	disabled person, and the installation of such items as a wheelchair lift, hoist, or
13	attached ramp to allow an orthopedically disabled person to enter the motor vehicle.
14	C. The exemption authorized by this Section shall entitle the purchaser to a
15	rebate of the state sales and use tax paid on the vehicle which may be claimed only
16	after the vehicle modifications have been completed. To claim the exemption, the
17	purchaser shall request a rebate in the form and manner prescribed by rule
18	promulgated by the secretary of the Department of Revenue in accordance with the
19	Administrative Procedure Act. A purchaser who requests a rebate shall provide to
20	the secretary the prescription requiring the vehicle modifications for which a rebate
21	is requested, and a letter from the physician, chiropractor, or driver rehabilitation
22	specialist describing the orthopedic disability which requires such modifications, and
23	at the discretion of the secretary, provide documentation evidencing the purchase and
24	modification of the vehicle. In order to ensure the rebate provided for in this Section
25	is not misused, the secretary, in her regulations adopted in conjunction with the
26	Department of Health and Hospitals, shall provide for a method for the review by
27	appropriate personnel of the department of the prescriptions, letters, and other
28	documentation that the secretary deems necessary which are submitted with the
29	requests for rebate. The Department of Health and Hospitals is hereby directed to
30	review such documents as provided for in such regulations. The secretary shall pay

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1	a rebate to a purchaser who submits a rebate request which complies with the
2	provisions of law and rule, which payment shall be made from general collections.
3	Section 2. This Act shall become effective October 1, 2011, and shall apply to
4	purchases made on and after January 1, 2010.
