WILDLIFE & FISHERIES DEP: Provides relative to the regulation of reptiles and amphibians

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 56:6(30), 632.3(B), 632.4(Section heading) and (B), 632.5(A)
3	and (F), 632.5.1(Section heading), (A), (B), and (C), 632.6(C) and (D), 635, and
4	637.1(B)(2) and to enact R.S. 56:632.4(C) and (D), relative to reptiles and
5	amphibians; to provide for licenses; to provide for species of snakes allowed to be
6	imported, sold, or purchased; to provide for methods of collection; to provide for
7	definitions, and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 56:6(30), 632.3(B), 632.4(Section heading) and (B), 632.5(A) and
10	(F), 632.5.1(Section heading), (A), (B), and (C), 632.6(C) and (D), 635, and 637.1(B)(2) are
11	hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 56:632.4(C) and (D) are hereby enacted to read as
12	follows:
13	§6. Special powers and duties; statistics; rules and regulations; reports
14	The commission, through its secretary:
15	* * *
16	(30) Shall promulgate rules and regulations to control the importation and
17	private possession of nonindigenous constrictors in excess of twelve eight feet in
18	length, venomous snakes, and nonhuman primates. The rules shall provide

1	exceptions for certified animal sanctuaries, zoos, aquariums, wildlife research
2	centers, scientific organizations, and medical research facilities, including but not
3	limited to the University of Louisiana at Lafayette Primate Center and the Tulane
4	National Primate Research Center. Such rules shall address internet purchase of
5	such animals. Such rules shall also provide for permits for certain institutions and
6	for owners who can prove ownership prior to July 1, 2003.

12	§632.4. Reptile and amphibian collector's license; scientific research and collecting
13	collector's permit
14	A. All persons engaged in the commercial collection and sale of native
15	reptiles and amphibians collected in Louisiana must possess one of the following
16	licenses:

18	B. Collector license shall comply with reporting requirements set forth by
19	the department.
20	B. C. Persons engaged in legitimate herpetological research may request
21	from the secretary shall possess a scientific research and collecting collector's permit
22	prior to the removal of native reptiles or amphibians from the wild. Such permits
23	may be issued at the sole discretion of the secretary. No fee shall be charged for
24	such a permit. No specimens obtained under this permit may be sold.
25	C. D. A violation of this Section is a class three two violation.
26	§632.5 Reptile and amphibian wholesale/retail dealer's license; nonresident three-
27	day license
28	A. Any person buying, purchasing or acquiring, or handling, from any
29	person, by any means whatsoever, any species of native and nonnative reptiles and

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1	amphibians from within or outside the state, for sale or resale, or possessing native
2	or nonnative reptiles and amphibians for propogation for sale shall possess a reptile
3	and amphibian wholesale/retail dealer's license at a cost of two hundred twenty
4	dollars for a resident and eight hundred eighty dollars for a nonresident. This license
5	shall not apply to farm raised acquatic chelonians regulated under Title 3. or for
6	propagation for sale, any species of native reptile or amphibian, except farm raised
7	aquatic chelonians, or any live species of poisonous snake or constrictor, as
8	delineated in R.S. 56:632.5.1, in Louisiana, from within or outside the state, for sale,
9	or resale, whether on a commission basis or otherwise, is a wholesale/retail reptile
10	amphibian dealer and shall possess a reptile and amphibian wholesale/retail dealer's
11	license at a cost of two hundred twenty dollars for a resident and eight hundred
12	eighty dollars for a nonresident.

14	F. A violation of this Section is a class three two violation.

16	§632.5.1 Constrictors and poisonous venomous snakes
17	A. The importation, or private possession, selling, or purchasing of
18	constrictor snakes in excess of eight feet long, including but not limited to the
19	following species: Apodora papuana (Papuan python), Liasis olivacea, (Olive
20	python), Morelia spilota (Carpet or Diamond python), Morelia kinghorni (Scrub
21	python), Morelia amethystine Morelia amethystine (Amethystine python), Python
22	natalensis (Southern African python), Python sebae (African Rock python), Python
23	molurus (Indian or Burmese python), Python reticulatus (Reticulate python), any
24	species of the genus Boa (Boa constrictors), and any species of the genus Eunectes
25	(Anacondas), obtained in any manner, shall be only be allowed by permit issued by
26	the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries except for animals kept by <u>certified</u> animal
27	sanctuaries, zoos, aquariums, wildlife research centers, scientific organizations, and
28	medical research facilities as defined in the Animal Welfare Act, as found in the
29	United States Code Title 7, Chapter 54, 2132(e) 7 U.S.C. 2132(e). The importation,

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1	private possession, selling or purchasing of the following constrictor snake species
2	at any size in length shall be only by permit issued by the Department of Wildlife
3	and Fisheries: Boa constrictor (Boa Constrictor), Python reticulatus (Reticulated
4	Python), Python sebae (North African Python), Python natalensis (South African
5	Python), and all species in the genus Eunectes (Anacondas). Burmese pythons
6	(Python molurus) are prohibited from importation and possession, except for animals
7	kept by certified animal sanctuaries, zoos, aquariums, wildlife research centers,
8	scientific organizations, and medical research facilities as defined in the Animal
9	Welfare Act, 7 U.S.C. 2132(e).

10 B. The importation or private possession of venomous snakes, including any 11 species under current taxonomic standing recognized to belong to the Families 12 Viperidae (Pitvipers and Vipers), Crotalidae (Pit Vipers), Elapidae (Cobras and Mambas Elapids), and Hydrophiidae (Sea Snakes), Atractaspididae (Mole Vipers), 13 14 as well as the genera Dispholidus, Thelotornis, and Rhabdophis of the Family 15 Colubridae obtained in any manner, shall be only by permit issued by the 16 Department of Wildlife and Fisheries except for animals kept by certified animal 17 sanctuaries, zoos, aquariums, wildlife research centers, scientific organizations, and 18 medical research facilities as defined in the Animal Welfare Act, as found in the 19 United States Code Title 7, Chapter 54, 2132(e) 7 U.S.C. 2132(e). The importation 20 and possession of the following venomous snake species is prohibited: all species 21 in the family Atractaspididae (stiletto snakes); all species in the genera Dispholidus 22 (boomslangs), Thelotornis (twig snakes), and Rhabdophis (keelback snakes) of the 23 family Colubridae; and all species in the genera Naja, Ophiophagus, Aspidelaps, and 24 Walterinnesia (cobras), Dendroaspis (mambas), Oxyuranus (taipans), and Bungarus 25 (kraits) of the family Elapidae, except for animals kept by certified animal 26 sanctuaries, zoos, aquariums, wildlife research centers, scientific organizations, and 27 medical research facilities as defined in the Animal Welfare Act, 7 U.S.C. 2132(e).

1	C. The Louisiana Wildlife and Fisheries Commission is authorized to adopt
2	rules and regulations for the harvest, possession, sale, handling, housing, or
3	importation for species of constrictors and poisonous venomous snakes.

5	§632.6 Methods of collection

7	C. Any trap or other device designed to capture reptiles or amphibians,
8	which remains in the field unattended between routine inspections, must bear a tag
9	with the name, address, and license number of the collector. All such devices must
10	be checked every twenty-four hours or they must be rendered unworkable and
11	removed from the field during periods of nonuse.
12	D. A violation of this Section is a class one two violation.

14	§635. Diamondback terrapins; trapping; turtle eggs
15	A. No person shall take diamondback terrapins by means of traps of any
16	kind, and no person shall take the eggs of any species of turtle, except the red ear
17	(Trachemys Scripta), wherever found.
18	B. No person shall ship diamondback terrapins out of the state between the
19	fifteenth of April and the fifteenth of June. All diamondback terrapins caught by any
20	means whatsoever during that period shall be immediately returned to the water
21	alive.

23	§637.1. Definitions; applicability

25	B. Administration; enforcement; penalties

27	(2) Recreational use of wild box turtles. No more than two wild box turtles
28	per day may be taken for recreational purposes, and no person shall have in his or her
29	possession more than four two box turtles, regardless of species, at any time. A

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violation of this Paragraph shall constitute a class one two violation, R.S. 56:31

Abstract: Provides relative to the regulation of reptiles and amphibians, changes regulations for importation and possession of reptiles and amphibians, changes regulations for taking of reptiles and amphibians, changes regulations for taking of diamond terrapins, changes regulations for taking of wild box turtles, changes the violation level of listed provisions.

<u>Present law</u> requires the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission, through its secretary shall promulgate rules and regulations to control the importation and private possession of nonindigenous constrictors in excess of 12 feet in length. <u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by changing the size from 12 to 8 feet and allowing for exceptions for certified animal sanctuaries, zoos, aquariums, wildlife research centers, scientific organizations and medical research facilities.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a violation of <u>present law</u> (R.S. 56:632.3) is a class one violation. <u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by changing a violation from a class one to a class two violation.

<u>Present law</u> provides for requirements for persons engaged in the sale of native reptiles and amphibians in Louisiana. <u>Proposed law</u> adds additional license requirements to <u>present law</u>, as set forth by the department.

<u>Proposed law</u> clarifies language related to the reptile and amphibian wholesale/retail dealer's license.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a violation of <u>present law</u> (R.S. 56:632.5) is a class three violation. <u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by changing a violation from a class three to a class two violation.

<u>Present law</u> provides for certain species of constrictor snakes in excess of eight feet long that may be imported or possessed in accordance with a permit issued by the Dept. of Wildlife and Fisheries. <u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by removing certain species from those requirements. <u>Proposed law</u> adds certain species of constrictor snakes at any size that may be imported, possessed, or sold in accordance with a permit issued by the Dept. of Wildlife and Fisheries.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the importation of venomous snakes shall only be by permit issued by the Dept. of Wildlife and Fisheries. <u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by providing for certain species of venomous snakes that are prohibited from importation and possession, except under certain enumerated exceptions.

<u>Present law</u> provides for methods of collection of reptiles and amphibians. <u>Proposed law</u> provides for requirements for taking a reptile or amphibian with the use of traps or other devices.

<u>Present law</u> provides for taking of diamond terrapins. <u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by clarifying language and removing a time period for shipping diamondback terrapins out of the state.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the administration, enforcement, and penalties for taking of box turtles, and provides for limitations on taking of wild box turtles. <u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by changing the limit of box turtles a person may have in their possession from four to two. <u>Present law</u> provides that a violation of this paragraph shall be a class one violation. <u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by changing the violation from a class one violation to a class two violation.
