AN ACT

ELECTION DAYS: Provides relative to elections

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 18:402, relative to elections; to provide relative to the conduct
3	of elections; to provide relative to election dates; to provide relative to the authority
4	to call or hold elections; to remove provisions for certain elections; and to provide
5	for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 18:402 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
8	§402. Dates of primary and general elections
9	A. Gubernatorial elections. Elections for governor and officers elected at the
10	same time as the governor shall be held every four years, beginning in 1983, as
11	provided in this Subsection.
12	(1) Gubernatorial primary elections shall be held on the second to last
13	Saturday in October of an election year.
14	(2) Gubernatorial general elections shall be held on the fourth Saturday after
15	the second to last Saturday in October of an election year.
16	B. Congressional elections. Elections for members of congress and officers
17	elected at the same time as members of congress shall be held every two years,
18	beginning in 1982, as provided in this Subsection.

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1	(1) Primary elections for members of congress and officers elected at the
2	same time as members of congress shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first
3	Monday in November of an election year.
4	(2) General elections for members of congress and officers elected at the
5	same time as members of congress shall be held on the first Saturday in December
6	of an election year.
7	C. Municipal and ward elections. In all municipalities with a population of
8	less than four three hundred seventy-five thousand, elections for municipal and ward
9	officers who are not elected at the same time as the governor or members of congress
10	shall be held every four years as provided in this Subsection.
11	(1) Primary elections for municipal and ward officers who are not elected at
12	the same time as the governor or members of congress shall be held on the first
13	Saturday in April of an election year, or on the second Saturday in February of an
14	election year, if the statewide presidential preference primary election is scheduled
15	to be held on the second Saturday in February of the presidential election year, or on
16	the third Saturday in February of an election year, if the statewide presidential
17	preference primary election is scheduled to be held on the third Saturday in February
18	of the presidential election year.
19	(2) General elections for municipal and ward officers who are not elected at
20	the same time as the governor or members of congress shall be held on the fourth
21	Saturday after the first Saturday in April of an election year unless the primary
22	election for such officers is held on the second or third Saturday in February; in. In
23	such case, the general election shall be held on the fourth Saturday after the second
24	or third Saturday in February, as the case may be, of an election year.
25	D. Parochial and municipal elections in a parish containing a municipality
26	with a population of four three hundred seventy-five thousand or more. Elections for
27	parochial and municipal officers in a parish containing a municipality with a

6	or more shall be held on the fourth Saturday after the first Saturday in February of
7	an election year.
8	E. Special elections to fill newly created office or vacancy in office. An
9	election to fill a newly created office or <u>a</u> vacancy in an existing office, except the
10	office of state legislator or representative in congress, shall be held on the dates fixed
11	by the appropriate authority in the proclamation ordering a special election as
12	follows:
13	(1) A special primary election shall be held on the first of the following days
14	that is not less than eleven weeks after the date on which the proclamation calling the
15	special primary election was issued:
16	(a) The second to last Saturday in October, when the special general election
17	is held on the fourth Saturday after the second to last Saturday in October.
18	(b) The first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, when the special
19	general election is held on the first Saturday in December.
20	(c) The first Saturday in April, when the special general election is held on
21	the fourth Saturday after the first Saturday in April or on the second or third Saturday
22	in February during the presidential election year, if the statewide presidential
23	preference primary election is scheduled to be held on the second or third Saturday
24	in February of the presidential election year; however, However, commencing in
25	1986 and every fourth year thereafter, this date shall not be applicable in a parish

containing a municipality with a population of four three hundred seventy-five

(d) The third Saturday in October, when the special general election is held on the fourth Saturday after the third Saturday in October of 1985 and every fourth year thereafter.

- (e) The first Saturday in February of an election year for parish and municipal officers in a parish containing a municipality with a population of four three hundred seventy-five thousand or more.
 - (2) A special general election shall be held on one of the following days:
- (a) The fourth Saturday after the second to last Saturday in October of 1983 and every fourth year thereafter.
 - (b) The first Saturday in December of even-numbered years.
- (c) The fourth Saturday after the first Saturday in April of any year unless the primary election is held on the second or third Saturday in February; in, In such case, the general election shall be held on the fourth Saturday after the second or third Saturday in February, as the case may be; however. However, commencing in 1986 and every fourth year thereafter, this date shall not be applicable in a parish containing a municipality with a population of four three hundred seventy-five thousand or more.
- (d) The fourth Saturday after the third Saturday in October of 1985 and every fourth year thereafter.
- (e) The fourth Saturday after the first Saturday in February in a parish containing a municipality with a population of four three hundred seventy-five thousand or more, when the special primary election in such parish and municipality is held on the first Saturday in February of an election year for parish and municipal officers.
- (3) The secretary of state shall not include the name of any candidate on any ballot for a special election to fill a vacancy in any office to which this Subsection is applicable unless such special election has been called in accordance with the provisions of this Subsection and scheduled on one of the dates provided herein in this Subsection. Any elector who is eligible to vote in any such special election may

1	apply for injunctive relief to prohibit the placing of the name of any candidate in an
2	improperly called election on the ballot. Venue for such application shall be in any
3	parish in which the election is called, and the secretary of state shall be the proper
4	party defendant.
5	F. Bond, tax, or other elections. Every bond, tax, or other election at which
6	a proposition or question is to be submitted to the voters shall <u>only</u> be held only on
7	one of the following dates:
8	(1) The second to last Saturday in October or the fourth Saturday after the
9	second to last Saturday in October of 1983 and every fourth year thereafter.
10	(2) The first Saturday in October or the first Tuesday after the first Monday
11	in November of even-numbered years.
12	(3) The first Saturday in April or the fourth Saturday after the first Saturday
13	in April of any year or on the second or third Saturday in February or fourth Saturday
14	after the second or third Saturday in February, as the case may be, during the
15	presidential election year, if the statewide presidential preference primary election
16	is scheduled on the second or third Saturday in February of the presidential election
17	year; however,. However, commencing in 1994 and every fourth year thereafter, the
18	first Saturday in April shall not be applicable in a parish containing a municipality
19	with a population of four three hundred seventy-five thousand or more.
20	(4) The third Saturday in October or the fourth Saturday after the third
21	Saturday in October of 1985 and every fourth year thereafter.
22	(5) Repealed by Acts 2008, No. 134, §1.
23	(6) (5) For a parish containing a municipality with a population of four three
24	hundred seventy-five thousand or more, the first Saturday in February or the fourth
25	Saturday after the first Saturday in February in 1986 and every fourth year thereafter.
26	(7) In case of an emergency, upon application to and approval by the State
27	Bond Commission by two-thirds vote of its total membership, and with approval of

the governor, the governing authority of a parish, of a municipality, or of a parish or

city school board may conduct a bond or tax election on a Saturday which is not provided for in this Subsection.

G. Prohibited days. No election of any kind shall be held in this state on any of the days of Rosh Hashana, Yom Kippur, Sukkot, Shemini Atzeret, Simchat Torah, the first two days and the last two days of Passover, Shavuot, Tish'a B'Av, the two days preceding Labor Day or the three days preceding Easter. If the date of any election falls on any of the above-named these days, the election shall be held on the same weekday of the preceding week.

Abstract: Provides relative to elections.

<u>Present law</u> provides dates on which elections are authorized to be held and provides procedures for calling and holding elections on such dates. Specifically provides that in case of an emergency, upon application to and approval by the State Bond Commission by 2/3 vote of its total membership, and with approval of the governor, the governing authority of a parish, of a municipality, or of a parish or city school board may conduct a bond or tax election on a Saturday which is not provided for in <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> makes changes to such provisions and removes provisions of <u>present law</u> relative to emergency bond and tax elections.
