Prefiled pursuant to Article III, Section 2(A)(4)(b)(i) of the Constitution of Louisiana. PUBLIC RECORDS: Exempts certain information from the Public Records Law

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 44:31.2 and 33.1 and to enact R.S. 44:4(57), relative to public
3	records; to exempt certain personal information from the Public Records Law; to
4	provide exceptions; to provide relative to the public records awareness program; to
5	provide for the content of the program; to require each public body to provide certain
6	notice to the public; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 44:31.2 and 33.1 are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S.
9	44:4(57) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
10	§4. Applicability
11	This Chapter shall not apply:

13	(57)(a) To the social security number, driver's license number, financial
14	institution account number, credit or debit card number, or armed forces
15	identification number of a private person who has submitted the information to a
16	public body or official.
17	(b) The provisions of Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph shall not apply to
18	such information in records recorded in the mortgage or conveyance records, in
19	records of a court, or in marriage records.

1	(c) The provisions of Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph shall not prohibit
2	the disclosure of the driver's license number of a person to an insurer or insurance
3	support organization, or a self-insured entity, or its agents, employees, or contractors,
4	in connection with claims investigation activities, antifraud activities, rating, or

7	§31.2. Public records awareness program
8	The attorney general shall establish a program for educating the general
9	public, public bodies, and custodians regarding the provisions of this Chapter. Such
10	program may include brochures, pamphlets, videos, seminars, and Internet access to
11	information which provides training on the provisions of this Chapter, including the
12	custodian's responsibilities in connection with a request for records, the possibility
13	that information submitted to a public body may become public record pursuant to
14	the provisions of this Chapter, and the right of a person to institute court proceedings
15	if access to a record is denied by the custodian.

17	§33.1. Custodian; contact information; notice to public
18	<u>A.</u> Each public body that has a custodian of public records shall make the
19	contact information of the custodian available to the public in a manner that will
20	allow a member of the public to quickly determine the appropriate person to whom
21	a public records request should be submitted, including by placing such information
22	on the internet.
23	B. Each custodian shall use reasonable means to notify the public that
24	information submitted to the public body may become public record pursuant to the
25	provisions of this Chapter.

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Abstract: Provides that certain information is not subject to the Public Records Law, requires each public body to notify the public of the possibility that information submitted to the public body could become public, and provides that this possibility may be included as part of the public records awareness program.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 44:1 et seq.—Public Records Law) provides for access and retention of public records. Establishes a framework for the ready availability of public records to requesting persons.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that <u>present law</u> does not apply to the social security number, driver's license number, financial institution account number, credit or debit card number, or armed forces identification number of a private person who has submitted the information to a public body or official. Provides, however, that <u>proposed law</u> does not apply to records recorded in the mortgage or conveyance records, records of a court, or marriage records. Additionally provides that <u>proposed law</u> does not prohibit the disclosure of the driver's license number of a person to an insurer or insurance support organization, or a self-insured entity, or its agents, employees, or contractors, in connection with claims investigation activities, antifraud activities, rating, or underwriting.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 44:31.2) requires the attorney general to establish a program for educating the general public, public bodies, and custodians regarding the provisions of <u>present law</u> (the Public Records Law). Provides that the program may include brochures, pamphlets, videos, seminars, and Internet access to information which provides training on the provisions of <u>present law</u>, including the custodian's responsibilities in connection with a request for records and the right of a person to institute court proceedings if access to a record is denied by the custodian.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>. Additionally provides that the possibility that information submitted to a public body may become public record may be included in the public records awareness program.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires each custodian to use reasonable means to notify the public that information submitted to the public body may become public record pursuant to the provisions of <u>present law</u>.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

1. Provide that <u>proposed law</u> does not prohibit the disclosure of the driver's license number of a person to an insurer or insurance support organization, or a self-insured entity, or its agents, employees, or contractors, in connection with claims investigation activities, antifraud activities, rating, or underwriting.
