Hazel HB No. 640

Abstract: Requires sex offenders to comply with all sex offender registration and notification requirements in order to be eligible for a reduced registration period.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the period of time a sex offender is required to register can be reduced if the offender maintains a clean record for a certain period of time.

CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

Present law defines "clean record" as all of the following:

- (1) Not being convicted of any offense for which imprisonment for more than one year may be imposed.
- (2) Not being convicted of any sex offense.
- (3) Successfully completing any periods of supervised release, probation, or parole.
- (4) Successfully completing an appropriate sex offender treatment program.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds compliance with all sex offender registration and notification requirements to the definition of "clean record".
