EMPLOYMENT/WAGES-MINIMUM: Provides for a state minimum wage

AN ACT

| 2 | To enact Chapter 6-A of Title 23 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be |
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| 3 | comprised of R.S. 23:671 through 674, relative to minimum wage; to establish a state |
| 4 | minimum wage; to provide a varying rate depending on the number of employees; |
| 5 | to provide for procedures for the determination of an annual increase; to provide for |
| 6 | enforcement; to provide for exceptions; and to provide for related matters. |
| 7 | CHAPTER 6-A. MINIMUM WAGE |
| 8 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: |
| 9 | Section 1. Chapter 6-A of Title 23 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950. |
| 10 | comprised of R.S. 23:671 through 674 is hereby enacted to read as follows: |
| 11 | §671. Minimum wage; establishment |
| 12 | A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the state |
| 13 | minimum wage is established and set as follows: |
| 14 | (1) The minimum wage shall be set at eight dollars and twenty-five cents per |
| 15 | hour for businesses with two hundred forty-nine thousand, nine hundred ninety nine |
| 16 | or fewer employees. Every business with two hundred forty-nine thousand, nine |
| 17 | hundred ninety nine or fewer employees shall pay to each employee wages at a rate |
| 18 | of not less than eight dollars and twenty-five cents per hour for hours worked in a |
| 19 | pay period regardless of how the time at work is measured. |
| 20 | (2) The minimum wage shall be set at eight dollars and fifty cents per hour |
| 21 | for businesses with at least two hundred and fifty thousand employees. Every |

| 1 | business with at least two hundred and fifty thousand employees shall pay to each |
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| 2 | employee wages at a rate of not less than eight dollars and fifty cents per hour for |
| 3 | hours worked in a pay period regardless of how the time at work is measured. |
| 4 | (3)(a) Beginning January 1, 2016, the minimum wage shall increase annually |
| 5 | on January 1 by two and one-half percent. |
| 6 | (b) The executive director of the Louisiana Workforce Commission shall |
| 7 | calculate the new minimum wage annually and the legislature shall reevaluate the |
| 8 | amount every four years beginning with the 2020 Regular Session of the Legislature. |
| 9 | B. If, at any time, the federal minimum hourly wage rate set by Section 6 of |
| 10 | the federal Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938, or a successor federal law, is raised to |
| 11 | a level higher than the state minimum wage rate, then the state minimum wage rate |
| 12 | shall be increased to the level of the federal minimum wage rate and all subsequent |
| 13 | increases pursuant to Paragraph (A)(3) of this Section shall be applied to the state |
| 14 | minimum wage rate. |
| 15 | §672. Enforcement |
| 16 | The Louisiana Workforce Commission shall be responsible for the |
| 17 | enforcement of R.S. 23:671 and is authorized and directed to promulgate rules and |
| 18 | regulations pursuant to the provisions of the Administrative Procedures Act |
| 19 | necessary for the implementation of the provisions of this Chapter. |
| 20 | <u>§673. Penalties</u> |
| 21 | A. Whoever violates the provisions of R.S. 23:671 shall be fined not less |
| 22 | than five hundred dollars and not more than one thousand dollars per employee not |
| 23 | receiving minimum wage. The employer shall pay the employee the difference |
| 24 | between the wages actually paid to the employee and the minimum wage rate in |
| 25 | effect at the time the employee was paid. |
| 26 | B. Penalties may be imposed by a ruling of the executive director pursuant |
| 27 | to an adjudicatory hearing held in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, |
| 28 | R.S. 49:950 et seq. |

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1 §674. Exceptions

The provisions of this Chapter shall not apply to student employees of the

state or student employees of state colleges and universities.

Hunter HB No. 646

Abstract: Establishes a state minimum wage.

<u>Proposed law</u> establishes a state minimum wage and sets it at \$8.25 per hour for businesses that have 249,999 or fewer employees and \$8.50 per hour for businesses with 250,000 or more employees.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that the employers of tipped employees make up the difference between the \$2.13 per hour paid to the employee plus tips and the state minimum wage.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the state minimum wage shall be adjusted annually at a rate of 2.5% to allow for inflation, beginning July 1, 2016.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that every 4 years the legislature reexamine the minimum wage, starting with the 2020 Regular Session of the Legislature.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the executive director of the Louisiana Workforce Commission (LWC) determine the increase amount and new annual minimum wage rate.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that if the federal minimum wage is raised, the state minimum wage shall also be raised and the annual increase shall continue based on the increased amount.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides a fine of not less than \$500 and not more than \$1,000 per employee for failure to pay minimum wage.

<u>Proposed law</u> further requires that an employer who fails to pay his employee minimum wage shall pay the employee the difference between what the employee was paid, and minimum wage.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that LWC shall be in charge of enforcement of the minimum wage laws and authorizes the agency to promulgate rules and regulations necessary in its implementation.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides the procedure for the executive director of LWC to impose penalties.

<u>Proposed law</u> excludes student workers employed with the state and with state colleges and universities from the minimum wage requirement.
