BUDGETARY CONTROLS: Removes certain reporting requirements

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 39:1561(A), relative to reporting requirements; to remove certain
3 reports required by executive branch agencies; and to provide for related matters.

4 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

5 Section 1. R.S. 39:1561(A) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

6 §1561. Authority and duties of the commissioner of administration

7 A. Except as otherwise provided in this Chapter, the commissioner of
8 administration, hereinafter referred to as "the commissioner," shall have the authority and
9 responsibility to promulgate regulations, consistent with this Chapter, governing the
10 procurement, management, and control of any and all supplies, services, major repairs, and
11 personal, professional, consulting, or social services required to be procured by the state.

12 However, the commissioner shall not require by rule or regulation any policy or management
13 board of public higher education or any institution under their jurisdiction to prepare or
14 submit a monthly report on items purchased from state contracts or on contract item usage
15 to the division of administration. ~~The quarterly report listing purchases for under five
16 thousand dollars and the annual report for purchases above five thousand dollars on all items
17 purchased from state contracts shall be sufficient to meet the requirements of this Chapter.~~
