REAPPORTIONMENT/JUDGES: Provides relative to the First Circuit Court of Appeal (Item \#7)

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 13:312(1)(b) and 312.1(A), relative to the Court of Appeal for the First Circuit; to provide election sections for the election of judges to the second district of the Court of Appeal for the First Circuit; to provide for the assignment of judgeships for election purposes; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
Section 1. R.S. 13:312(1)(b) and 312.1(A) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
§312. Courts of appeal; circuits and districts
There shall be five court of appeal circuits, which shall be subdivided into districts as follows:
1.
(b) Districts of first circuit.
(i) The parishes of Ascension, Assumption, Iberville, Lafourche, Pointe Coupee, St. Mary, Terrebonne, and West Baton Rouge shall compose the first district of the first circuit. The first district shall be further divided into two election sections. Election section one shall be composed of Ascension Parish, Assumption Parish, Iberville Parish, Pointe Coupee Parish, and West Baton Rouge Parish.

Election section two shall be composed of Lafourche Parish, St. Mary Parish, and Terrebonne Parish.
(ii) The parish of East Baton Rouge shall compose the second district of the first circuit. The second district shall be further divided into two election sections.

(bb) Election Section 2 shall be composed of Precincts 1-1, 1-2, 1-3, 1-4, $1-5,1-6,1-7,1-8,1-10,1-13,1-14,1-15,1-16,1-17,1-18,1-19,1-21,1-22,1-23$, 1-24, 1-25, 1-26, 1-27, 1-28, 1-29, 1-30, 1-31, 1-32, 1-36, 1-37, 1-38, 1-44, 1-45, $1-46,1-50,1-51,1-54,1-58,1-61,1-62,1-63,1-67,1-68,1-70,1-77,1-78,1-82$, 1-83, 1-84, 1-85, 1-86, 1-88, 1-91, 1-92, 1-93, 1-94, 1-95, 1-97, 1-100, 1-101, 1-102, 1-104, 2-1, 2-2, 2-3, 2-4, 2-5, 2-9, 2-10, 2-11, 2-12, 2-13, 2-14, 2-15, 2-16, 2-17, 2-18, 2-19, 2-20, 2-21, 2-22, 2-23, 2-24, 2-25, 2-26, 2-27, 2-28, 2-29, 2-30, 2-31, 2-32, 3-5, 3-8, 3-24, 3-42, 3-44, 3-50 and 3-54 of East Baton Rouge Parish.
(iii) The parishes of East Feliciana, Livingston, St. Helena, St. Tammany, Tangipahoa, Washington, and West Feliciana shall compose the third district of the first circuit.
§312.1. Circuit court of appeal; domicile; number of judges; election
A. The Court of Appeal for the First Circuit, domiciled in the city of Baton Rouge, shall have twelve judges. Four judges shall be elected from each of the three districts composing the circuit by the qualified electors of each district, respectively. However, in In the first district, one judge, Division C, shall be elected from election
section one by the qualified electors of election section one, and one judge, Division A, shall be elected from election section two by the qualified electors of election section two. The remaining two judges in the first district, Divisions B and D, shall be elected by the qualified electors of the entire first district. In the second district, two judges shall be elected from election section one by the qualified electors of election section one, and two judges shall be elected from election section two by the qualified electors of election section two.

Section 2.(A) The precincts referenced in this Act are those precincts identified as Voting Districts (VTDs) in the 2010 Census Redistricting TIGER/Line Shapefiles for the State of Louisiana.
(B) When a precinct referenced in this Act has been subdivided by action of the parish governing authority on a nongeographic basis or subdivided by action of the parish governing authority on a geographic basis in accordance with the provisions of R.S. 18:532.1, the enumeration in this Act of the general precinct designation shall include all nongeographic and all geographic subdivisions thereof, however such subdivisions may be designated. The territorial limits of the election sections as provided in this Act shall continue in effect without change regardless of any changes made to the precincts by the parish governing authority.

Section 3.(A) The judgeships currently designated as Division A and Division C of the second district of the Court of Appeal for the First Circuit are hereby assigned to election section one for election purposes.
(B) The judgeships currently designated as Division B and Division D of the second district of the Court of Appeal for the First Circuit are hereby assigned to election section two for election purposes.

Section 4. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If

1 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
2 effective on the day following such approval.

## DIGEST

Abstract: Provides geographic boundaries for the election sections in the second district of the Court of Appeal for the First Circuit and provides that two judges are elected from each election section.

Statistical summaries of proposed law as well as maps illustrating proposed district boundaries accompany this digest. (Attached to hard copies of the bill distributed during session and available as a separate document on the Internet.)

Present law provides that the second district of the Court of Appeal for the First Circuit is comprised of East Baton Rouge Parish. Divides the second district into two election sections. Provides that three judges are elected from election section one, and one judge is elected from election section two.

Proposed law changes the composition of election sections one and two. Provides that two judges are elected from election section one and two judges are elected from election section two. Provides that the judgeships currently designated as Division A and Division C of the second district of the Court of Appeal for the First Circuit are assigned to election section one for election purposes. Provides that the judgeships currently designated as Division B and Division D of the second district of the Court of Appeal for the First Circuit are assigned to election section two for election purposes.

Proposed law specifies that the precincts referenced in proposed law are those precincts identified as Voting Districts (VTDs) in the 2010 Census Redistricting TIGER/Line Shapefiles for the state of La. Provides that when a precinct referenced in proposed law has been subdivided by action of the parish governing authority on a nongeographic basis or subdivided by action of the parish governing authority on a geographic basis in accordance with the provisions of present law (R.S. 18:532.1), the enumeration in proposed law of the general precinct designation shall include all nongeographic and all geographic subdivisions thereof; however, such subdivisions may be designated. Provides that the territorial limits of the election sections as provided in proposed law shall continue in effect without change regardless of any changes made to the precincts by the parish governing authority.

Population data in the summaries accompanying this digest are derived from 2010 Census Redistricting Data (Public Law 94-171), Summary File for Louisiana. Population data, statistical information, and maps are supplied for purposes of information and analysis and comprise no part of proposed law.
