LAW ENFORCEMENT: Authorizes the governor to activate national guard troops to assist local law enforcement in certain municipalities upon reaching a certain homicide rate

AN ACT
To enact R.S. 29:723(3)(c) and 724(H), relative to the governor's powers; to provide for the
definition of "emergency"; to authorize the governor to activate the national guard
and state law enforcement resources in certain cities or municipalities that have a
certain murder rate; and to provide for related matters.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
Section 1. R.S. 29:723(3)(c) and 724(H) are hereby enacted to read as follows:
§723. Definitions
As used in this Chapter:
* * *
(3) "Emergency" means:
* * *
(c) For purposes of this Paragraph, any city or municipality having a
population in excess of two hundred thousand according to the latest decennial
census and a murder rate of forty-five persons per every one hundred thousand in
population.
* * *
§724. Powers of the governor
* * *

1	H. In the event of an emergency declared by the governor pursuant to R.S.
2	29:723(3)(c), all state law enforcement resources including the national guard may
3	be activated or called upon to assist local law enforcement with such emergency.

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HB No. 758

Abstract: Authorizes the governor to declare an emergency that activates the national guard and utilize state law enforcement when certain cities or municipalities based on population reach a certain murder rate.

<u>Present law</u> defines emergency as the actual or threatened condition which may be created from a disaster or any natural or manmade event which results in an interruption in the delivery of utility services to any consumer and affects the safety, health, or welfare of a La. resident and any national or state emergency including acts of terrorism or a congressional authorization or presidential declaration pursuant to the War Powers Resolution (50 U.S.C. 1541 et seq.).

<u>Proposed law</u> expands the definition of emergency to include a murder rate of 45 persons for every 100,000 in any city or municipality having a population in excess of 200,000.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the governor to declare an emergency pursuant to <u>proposed law</u> and to activate the national guard or utilize state law enforcement resources to assist local law enforcement with the declared emergency.
