HISTORIC COMMEMORATION: Creates the La. Bicentennial Commission for the purpose of commemorating the anniversary of Louisiana's attainment of statehood

AN ACT

2	To enact Chapter 27 of Title 25 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised
3	of R.S. 25:1231 through 1237, and R.S. 36:209(Q), to create the Louisiana
4	Bicentennial Commission; to provide for membership on the commission and its
5	operation; to provide relative to powers, duties, and activities of the commission; to
6	provide relative to funds and property of the commission; to provide for termination
7	of the commission; and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. Chapter 27 of Title 25 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950,
10	comprised of R.S. 25:1231 through 1237, is hereby enacted to read as follows:
11	CHAPTER 27. LOUISIANA BICENTENNIAL COMMISSION
12	§1231. Declaration of purpose
13	A. The Legislature of Louisiana hereby recognizes that the year 2012 marks
14	the two hundredth anniversary of Louisiana's attainment of statehood upon its
15	admission by congress as the eighteenth state in the Union.

1	B. The legislature further recognizes that, as the state approaches its
2	bicentennial of statehood, it is appropriate to celebrate and commemorate this
3	anniversary through local and statewide observances and activities planned,
4	encouraged, coordinated, and conducted by a commission created for such purpose.
5	§1232. Louisiana Bicentennial Commission; creation; appointments of members;
6	officers; meetings; domicile
7	A. The Louisiana Bicentennial Commission, hereafter referred to as the
8	"commission", is hereby created and established in the Department of Culture,
9	Recreation and Tourism for the purpose of leading the state in its commemoration
10	of attaining statehood.
11	B.(1) The commission shall consist of members appointed as follows:
12	(a) Three members appointed by the governor.
13	(b) Three members appointed by the lieutenant governor.
14	(c) Three members appointed by the president of the Senate.
15	(d) Three members appointed by the speaker of the House of
16	Representatives.
17	(2) The twelve members of the commission shall be appointed in such a
18	manner that at least one member shall be from each congressional district in the state
19	of Louisiana as each such district exists on the effective date of this Paragraph. In
20	addition, the appointing authorities shall make such appointments in such manner as
21	to assure that the commission membership shall reflect as nearly as possible a cross
22	section of the race, gender, and economic status of the state's population.
23	(3) Members shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. A
24	vacancy in the membership of the commission shall be filled in the same manner as
25	the original appointment.
26	C. The members of the commission shall elect a chairman, vice chairman,
27	and other officers and may employ such staff as they deem necessary for the efficient
28	operation of the business of the commission.

1	D. The members of the commission shall serve without compensation, but
2	they shall be reimbursed, on a vouchered basis, for actual expenses, including travel
3	expenses, to the extent that funds are made available for such purpose; however, no
4	public funds shall be expended by the commission unless specifically appropriated
5	by the legislature for such purpose.
6	E. The commission shall hold its initial meeting no later than October 1,
7	2010, and thereafter shall meet at least monthly according to a schedule established
8	by it. Special meetings shall be held on call of the chairman or of a quorum of the
9	members of the commission. For all regular or special meetings, the chairman or
10	other members calling the meeting shall give at least seven days notice to the
11	members of the commission of the time and place where the meeting will be held.
12	A majority of the members of the commission shall constitute a quorum for the
13	transaction of any and all business at any regular or special meeting.
14	F. The commission shall be domiciled in Baton Rouge but may hold public
15	meetings elsewhere in the state.
16	§1233. Powers and duties
17	The commission shall:
18	(1) Plan and develop activities appropriate to commemorate the bicentennial
19	of Louisiana's statehood, including a limited number of projects to be undertaken
20	by the state seeking to harmonize and balance the important goals of ceremony and
21	celebration with the equally important goals of scholarship and education.
22	(2) Encourage private organizations and local governments to organize and
23	participate in bicentennial activities commemorating and examining the historic
24	events associated with Louisiana's statehood.
25	(3) Serve as a clearinghouse for collecting and disseminating information
26	about bicentennial events and plans in the state.
27	(4) Cooperate and coordinate with any similar commission created by the
28	United States government or any other state in preparing to commemorate and
29	celebrate this important historical event.

1	(5) Encourage state agencies to develop bicentennial programs such as the
2	creation of commemorative automobile license plates and public programs in state
3	and local parks, museums, and libraries.
4	(6) Seek cooperation, advice, and assistance from both private and
5	governmental agencies and organizations, including local governments, learned
6	societies, academic institutions, and historical, patriotic, philanthropic, civic, and
7	professional groups and associations.
8	(7) Adopt rules and regulations regarding the use of any logos, symbols, or
9	marks originated under authority of and certified by the commission for use in
10	connection with the state commemoration of the bicentennial, or any facsimile
11	thereof.
12	§1234. Funding; donations and grants
13	The commission may solicit, accept, use, and dispose of any private or public
14	funds in the form of donations of money, grants, property, or personal services from
15	individuals, corporations, and governments for such purposes, all in accordance with
16	R.S. 36:810 and this Chapter. The office of management and finance of the
17	Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism may adopt any necessary rules or
18	procedures for determining the value of donations to the commission. The
19	commission shall, by April 1, 2011, present to the Joint Legislative Committee on
20	the Budget a master plan outlining the goals, objectives, and performance indicators
21	of the commission for the duration of its existence, which shall include projected
22	expenditures of the commission.
23	§1235. Annual report
24	The commission shall submit an annual report to the lieutenant governor, the
25	president of the Senate, and the speaker of the House of Representatives. Such
26	report shall be submitted no later than sixty days prior to the beginning of the regular
27	session of the legislature in 2011 and 2012. The reports shall include specific
28	recommendations and plans for commemorating and coordinating the bicentennial
29	and related activities.

1	§1236. Cooperation by other state entities
2	All departments, commissions, boards, agencies, officers, and institutions of
3	the state and all subdivisions thereof shall cooperate with the commission in carrying
4	out the purposes of this Chapter.
5	§1237. Termination of commission
6	The commission shall terminate on December 31, 2012.
7	Section 2. R.S. 36:209(Q) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
8	§209. Transfer of boards, commissions, departments, and agencies to Department of
9	Culture, Recreation and Tourism
10	* * *
11	Q. The Louisiana Bicentennial Commission (R.S. 25:1231-1237) shall be
12	placed within the Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism as provided for
13	agencies transferred in accordance with R.S. 36:802.

Tucker HB No. 809

Abstract: Creates the La. Bicentennial Commission within the Dept. of Culture, Recreation, and Tourism for the purpose of commemorating the anniversary of La.'s attainment of statehood.

<u>Proposed law</u> creates the La. Bicentennial Commission within the Dept. of Culture, Recreation and Tourism (CRT). Provides for 12 commission members appointed as follows: three members appointed by the governor and three members appointed by the lt. governor; three members appointed by the Senate president; and three members appointed by the House speaker. Requires that members be appointed in such a manner that at least one member represents each congressional district in the state as the districts exist on the effective date of <u>proposed law</u>; also requires the appointing authorities to make appointments in a manner which assures that the membership reflects as nearly as possible a cross section of the race, gender, and economic status of the state's population.

Allows the commission to employ staff and provides that members shall serve without compensation but be reimbursed for expenses subject to the availability of funds. Provides that no public funds may be expended by the commission unless specifically appropriated by the legislature. Requires that the commission hold its initial meeting not later than Oct. 1, 2010, and meet at least monthly thereafter. Provides for commission to be domiciled in Baton Rouge but authorizes it to hold public meetings elsewhere in the state.

Provides that the commission shall:

- (1) Plan and develop activities to commemorate La.'s bicentennial of statehood.
- (2) Encourage private organizations and local governments to participate.
- (3) Serve as a clearinghouse for information about bicentennial events and plans.
- (4) Cooperate and coordinate with any similar commission throughout the U.S.
- (5) Encourage state agencies to develop bicentennial programs.
- (6) Seek cooperation from private and governmental agencies and organizations.
- (7) Adopt rules and regulations regarding the use of any logos, symbols, or marks for use in connection with the bicentennial commemoration.

Authorizes the commission to solicit, accept, use, and dispose of money and other property. Provides that CRT may adopt rules or procedures for determining the value of donations.

Requires the commission, by April 1, 2011, to present the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget a master plan, including projected expenditures, and to submit an annual report to the lieutenant governor and the presiding officers of the legislature at least 30 days prior to the beginning of 2011 and 2012 R.S. Requires the cooperation of state agencies, officials, and subdivisions in carrying out proposed law.

Places the commission in CRT pursuant to <u>present law</u> which grants policymaking and rulemaking authority to the commission but which grants CRT certain personnel and fiscal and budgetary authority.

Provides that the commission shall terminate on Dec. 31, 2012.

Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Municipal, Parochial and Cultural Affairs</u> to the <u>original</u> bill.

- 1. Added requirement that members be appointed in such a manner that at least one member represents each congressional district.
- 2. Remainder of amendments are technical.

House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill.

1. Relative to board membership, added requirement that the appointing authorities make appointments in a manner which assures that the membership reflects as nearly as possible a cross section of the race, gender, and economic status of the state's population.
