STUDENT/ASSESSMENT: Eliminates provisions relative to LEAP, iLeap, end of course testing, and the graduation exit exam for students in public schools

§24.4. Louisiana Competency-Based Education Program; statewide standards for required subjects; <a href="Louisiana Educational Assessment Program">Louisiana Educational Assessment Program</a>; parish or city school board comprehensive pupil progression plans; waivers

A. As used in this Section, the following words, terms, and phrases shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this Subsection, except when the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

(1) "The Louisiana Competency-Based Education Program" means the coordination of all existing statutory provisions and State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education policies and guidelines to be implemented by the Department of Education which affect pupil performance with the development and establishment of statewide curriculum standards for required subjects for the public elementary and secondary schools of this state, the complete implementation of the Louisiana Educational Assessment Program, the involvement of all federal instructional programs, vocational programs, special education programs, and teacher education programs in this state, and the pupil progression plans for the public elementary and secondary school systems of this state.

(3) "Pupil progression plan" means the comprehensive plan developed and adopted by each parish or city school board which shall be based on student performance on the Louisiana Educational Assessment Program with goals and objectives which are compatible with the Louisiana Competency-Based Education Program and which supplements the minimum standards approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education. A pupil progression plan shall

17	uniform system of assessment based in part on criterion referenced tests to determine
18	pupil status, pupil progress, and the degree to which such minimum proficiency

**Abstract:** Eliminates provisions relative to LEAP, *i*Leap, end of course testing, and the graduation exit exam.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the administration of certain tests to public school students and specifies certain types of tests to be administered to students in certain grades. Certain levels of proficiency must be attained on certain tests as a prerequisite for promotion to the next grade. Some such tests are administered as part of "the Louisiana Educational Assessment Program" (LEAP), defined as a process of measuring pupil performance in relation to grade appropriate skills, state curriculum standards, and national educational indices, and the integrated Louisiana Educational Assessment Program (*i*Leap). <u>Present law</u> also provides for end of course testing with respect to certain career and technical education courses and contains references to the graduation exit exam. (Per <u>present BESE policy</u>, the graduation exit exam is in the process of being "phased out" and replaced with end of course testing.)

<u>Proposed law</u> deletes <u>present law</u> provisions pertaining to the following:

- (1) LEAP (La. Educational Assessment Program) and *i*Leap (integrated La. Educational Assessment Program).
- (2) End of course testing.
- (3) Graduation exit exam.
