SUPPLEMENTAL PAY: Provides state supplemental pay to public emergency medical services practitioners

1 AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 40:1666.1(A)(1) and (2) and (C) and to enact R.S. 40:1666.3.1, relative to state supplemental pay for certain public employees; to authorize payment of a state supplement for the salaries of certain emergency medical services practitioners; to provide with respect to requirements for and the amount of such payments; to provide relative to disbursement of such payments; to make technical corrections; to provide an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 40:1666.1(A)(1) and (2) and (C) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 40:1666.3.1 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§1666.1. Extra compensation

A.(1)(a) In addition to the compensation now paid by any municipality, parish, fire protection district, or other political subdivision maintaining a fire department, or by the Chitimacha Tribe of Louisiana or the Coushatta Tribe of Louisiana, hereinafter referred to as "tribe", or by any nonprofit corporation contracting with any such political subdivision to provide fire protection services to every paid, regularly employed employee, as distinguished from part-time employees and volunteers of such fire department, who are carried on the payroll of such fire department, and every employee as defined in this Subsection who is paid from funds of the parish or municipality or tribe obtained through lawfully adopted bond

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issues, lawfully assessed taxes, or other funds available for such purpose, either directly or through a board or commission set up by law or ordinance of the parish or municipality or tribe, shall be paid extra compensation by the state in the amount of six hundred dollars per month for each such paid employee who has completed or who hereafter completes one year of service. The provisions of Paragraph (5) of this Subsection shall govern the requirements for length of service for employees who were ordered to active military duty in the armed services of the United States during their initial term of employment.

- (b)(i) Beginning July 1, 2026, in addition to the compensation now paid by any municipality, parish, fire protection district, or other political subdivision to every paid, regularly employed emergency medical services practitioner employed by a political subdivision of the state shall be paid extra compensation by the state in the amount of six hundred dollars per month for each emergency medical services practitioner who has completed or who hereafter completes one year of service.
- (ii) For the purposes of this Section, unless context clearly indicates otherwise, the term "emergency medical services practitioner" means a person employed as a licensed emergency medical technician, a licensed advanced emergency medical technician, or a licensed paramedic. The term shall not include a part-time employee or volunteer who is carried on the payroll of a political subdivision.
- (2) The term "employee" as used herein expressly excludes any person hired primarily to perform secretarial and clerical duties, switchboard operators, secretaries, record clerks, maintenance personnel, and mechanics.; With respect to individuals employed to provide fire protection services as provided in Subparagraph (1)(a) of this Subsection, it shall expressly exclude employees hired after March 31, 1986; who have not completed and passed a certified fireman's training program equal to National Fire Protection Association Standard 1001 Firefighter I Certification or a firefighter's training program as approved by the office of state fire marshal Fire and Emergency Training Academy in accordance with R.S. 40:1541 et

4	C.(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the

11	§1666.3.1. Warrants for payments to emergency medical services providers
12	A. Notwithstanding any provision of R.S. 40:1666.3 to the contrary, the
13	funds credited and dedicated as provided in this Chapter for payments made to
14	emergency medical services practitioners shall be disbursed upon warrants approved
15	and certified by the head of the political subdivision employing such emergency
16	medical services practitioners, which warrants shall have attached to them a detailed
17	list of the names of the employees for whose benefit any particular warrant is drawn,
18	together with the completed years of service of such employees and such other
19	information as the Department of Public Safety and Corrections may require.
20	B. The head of the political subdivision employing an eligible emergency
21	medical services practitioner shall forward the approved and certified warrants to the
22	Department of Public Safety and Corrections and, after obtaining approval of the
23	board as provided in R.S. 40:1666.8, on the basis of such warrants, the Department
24	of Public Safety and Corrections shall issue payments representing the amount to be
25	paid out of state funds to each emergency medical services practitioner in accordance
26	with the provisions of this Subsection. The secretary shall issue payments to each
27	individual in whose favor they are drawn by such means as he shall determine.
28	C. The head of the political subdivision employing eligible emergency
29	medical services practitioners who is charged with the responsibility of preparing the

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pay rolls for such employees, shall include the additional compensation paid by the state to such employees in the calculation and deduction from the pay of such employees of the sums required by state or federal law to be withheld by an employer, such as federal income tax and social security tax or contributions to local retirement systems. Any officials charged with withholding sums from the pay of an emergency medical services practitioner shall be further charged with the responsibility of transmitting the sums withheld in accordance with the law or laws requiring the withholding. D. The additional compensation paid by the state pursuant to R.S. 40:1666.1(A)(1)(b) shall be included in the calculation and computation of the total wages paid to the emergency medical services practitioner in the determination of employer contributions to any retirement system or pension fund of which such employee may be a member as well as in the determination of retirement eligibility and benefits which may accrue to the employee under any retirement system or pension fund, as well as in the determination of any other employee benefits, sick leave, or disability pay to which the emergency medical services practitioner might be entitled. Section 2. This Act shall take effect and become operative if and when the proposed amendment of Article VII of the Constitution of Louisiana contained in the Act which

Abstract: Authorizes payment of state supplements to the salaries of certain emergency medical services practitioners.

<u>Present law</u> provides for state supplemental pay of \$600 per month for any regularly employed firefighter who is paid not less than \$300 per month by any municipality, parish, fire protection district, or other political subdivision maintaining a fire department, or by the Chitimacha Tribe of La., or Coushatta Tribe of La., or any nonprofit corporation contracting

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with any political subdivision to provide fire protection services and who completes one year of service. Proposed law retains present law.

Beginning July 1, 2026, <u>proposed law</u> authorizes state supplemental pay of \$600 per month for any regularly employed emergency medical services practitioner employed by a political subdivision of the state who completes one year of service. Defines "emergency medical services practitioner" for the purposes of <u>proposed law</u> to mean a person employed as a licensed emergency medical technician, a licensed advanced emergency medical technician, or a licensed paramedic. Further provides the term does not include a part-time employee or volunteer who is carried on the payroll of a political subdivision.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the term "employee" for purposes of <u>present law</u> expressly excludes any person hired primarily to perform secretarial and clerical duties, switchboard operators, secretaries, record clerks, maintenance personnel, and mechanics. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>. <u>Present law</u> further provides that the term "employee" expressly excludes employees hired after March 31, 1986, who have not completed and passed a certified fireman's training program equal to National Fire Protection Association Standard 1001 Firefighter I Certification or a firefighter's training program as approved by the office of state fire marshal Fire and Emergency Training Academy in accordance with <u>present law</u> and it also expressly excludes part-time employees and volunteers of such municipal, parish, tribe, or fire protection district fire departments. <u>Proposed law</u> limits these exclusions to individuals employed to provide fire protection services.

<u>Present law</u> limits application of salary supplements for tribal officers of the Chitimacha Tribe of La. and the Coushatta Tribe of La. to no more than 10 firemen. <u>Proposed law</u> specifies that this limitation applies to the compensation provided pursuant to <u>present law</u>.

Present law establishes procedures for warrants drawn to pay the monthly supplement authorized by present law. Proposed law retains present law procedures for the payment of supplements to firemen as provided in present law. Further provides procedures for warrants drawn to pay the monthly supplement authorized in proposed law public emergency medical services practitioners. Requires the head of the political subdivision employing the eligible practitioner to submit the approved and certified warrant for payment and requires inclusion of the same information as required for firemen's warrants in present law. Provides for payment of the warrants by the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections. Also requires the head of the political subdivision employing the eligible practitioner to calculate and deduct from such pay the required state and federal withholdings. Requires the compensation paid pursuant to proposed law to be included in the calculation and computation of total wages paid in the determination of employer contributions to any retirement system or pension fund that the recipient is a member of as well as in the determination of retirement eligibility and benefits in such system.

Effective if and when the proposed amendment of Article VII of the Constitution of La. contained in the Act which originated as House Bill No. ___ of this 2024 R.S. of the Legislature is adopted at a statewide election and becomes effective.
