FIRE PROTECTION: Provides relative to fire safe cigarette certification

1 AN ACT 2 To amend and reenact R.S. 13:5073(A) and (B)(introductory paragraph), relative to 3 cigarettes; to require certification to the attorney general of compliance with the 4 "Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act"; and to provide for related 5 matters. 6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 7 Section 1. R.S. 13:5073(A) and (B)(introductory paragraph) are hereby amended and 8 reenacted to read as follows: 9 §5073. Certifications; directory; tax stamps 10 A.(1) Every tobacco product manufacturer whose cigarettes are sold in this 11 state, whether directly or through a distributor, retailer, or similar intermediary or 12 intermediaries, shall execute and deliver on a form prescribed by the attorney general 13 a certification to the secretary and attorney general, no later than the thirtieth day of 14 April each year, certifying under penalty of perjury that, as of the date of such 15 certification, such tobacco product manufacturer either: is a participating 16 manufacturer; or is in full compliance with R.S. 13:5061 et seq., including all 17 installment payments required by R.S. 13:5075(E). Both a participating 18 manufacturer and a nonparticipating manufacturer shall also certify compliance with 19 the "Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act", R.S. 40:1626 et seq.

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B. Not later than ninety days after June 25, 2004, the <u>The</u> attorney general shall develop and make available for public inspection or publish on its website a directory listing all tobacco product manufacturers that have provided current and accurate certifications conforming to the requirements of Subsection A <u>of this</u>

<u>Section</u> and all brand families, including country of origin, that are listed in such certifications (the directory), except as noted below. <u>No participating manufacturer</u>

or nonparticipating manufacturer shall be included or retained in the directory without certification of compliance with the "Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act", R.S. 40:1626 et seq.

**Abstract:** Requires every tobacco product manufacturer whose cigarettes are sold in this state to provide the attorney general with certification of compliance with the "Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act".

<u>Present law</u> requires every tobacco product manufacturer whose cigarettes are sold in this state, whether directly or through a distributor, retailer, or similar intermediary or intermediaries, shall execute and deliver on a form prescribed by the attorney general a certification to the Dept. of Revenue and attorney general, no later than the 30th day of April each year, certifying under penalty of perjury that, as of the date of such certification, such tobacco product manufacturer either: is a participating manufacturer; or is in full compliance with the tobacco Master Settlement Agreement, including all installment payments required by <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> extends <u>present law</u> to require both a participating manufacturer and a nonparticipating manufacturer to also certify compliance with the "Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act".

<u>Present law</u> requires the attorney general to develop and make available for public inspection or publish on its website a directory listing all tobacco product manufacturers that have provided current and accurate certifications conforming to the requirements of <u>present law</u> and all brand families, including country of origin, that are listed in such certifications (the directory), except as noted in <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that no participating manufacturer or nonparticipating manufacturer shall be included or retained in the directory without certification of compliance with the "Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act", R.S. 40:1626 et seq.
