DWI: Prohibits certain persons from obtaining a driver's license

1 AN ACT 2 To enact R.S. 32:414.6, relative to driver's licenses; to disqualify certain persons from 3 driving after committing certain offenses; and to provide for related matters. 4 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 5 Section 1. R.S. 32:414.6 is hereby enacted to read as follows: §414.6. Revocation and disqualification upon plea or conviction of certain offenses 6 7 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, upon receiving 8 satisfactory evidence of conviction, plea of guilty, or plea of nolo contendere, or the 9 forfeiture of bail of a person charged with R.S. 14:32.1 or 39.2, the department shall 10 immediately revoke the person's driver's license, and the person shall be permanently 11 disqualified from obtaining a driver's license in this state. 12 Section 2. The provisions of this Act shall apply to all persons charged with R.S. 13 14:32.1 or 39.2 on or after January 1, 2011.

Hardy HB No. 966

Abstract: Revokes the driver's license of certain persons involved in vehicular homicide or first degree vehicular negligent injuring. Further permanently disqualifies such persons from obtaining a driver's license.

<u>Present law</u> provides persons convicted of or who plead guilty to R.S. 14:32.1, vehicular homicide, or R.S.14:39.2, first degree vehicular negligent injuring, are eligible to drive after the expiration of certain driver's license suspension or revocation times.

CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the driver's licenses of persons convicted of or who plead guilty to R.S. 14:32.1, vehicular homicide, or R.S. 14:39.2, first degree vehicular negligent injuring, shall immediately be revoked and the person shall be ineligible to obtain a driver's license in this state. <u>Proposed law</u> shall apply to persons charged with R.S. 14:32.1 or 39.2 on or after Jan. 1, 2011.
