CONTRACTS: Provides relative to the sale of undivided timber interests

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 3:4278.2(B), relative to the sale of co-owned timber; to provide 3 for the required consent of the co-owners or co-heirs; and to provide for related 4 matters. 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 6 Section 1. R.S. 3:4278.2(B) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: §4278.2. Sale of undivided timber interest; consent of co-owners; theft 7 8 9 B. A buyer who purchases the timber from a co-owner or co-heir of land 10 may not remove the timber without the consent of the co-owners or co-heirs 11 representing at least eighty fifty-one percent of the ownership interest in the land, 12 provided that he has made reasonable effort to contact the co-owners or co-heirs who 13 have not consented and, if contacted, has offered to contract with them on 14 substantially the same basis that he has contracted with the other co-owners or 15 co-heirs.

Abstract: Provides for the removal of co-owned timber upon the consent of 51% of the co-owners or co-heirs.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a buyer who purchases the timber from a co-owner or co-heir of land may not remove the timber without the consent of the co-owners or co-heirs representing at least 80% of the ownership interest in the land, provided that he has made reasonable effort to contact the co-owners or co-heirs who have not consented and, if contacted, has offered to contract with them on substantially the same basis that he has contracted with the other co-owners or co-heirs.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but lowers the required consent <u>from</u> 80% <u>to</u> 51% of the co-owners or co-heirs.
