2	To amend and reenact R.S. 37:1104(A), (B)(1) and (2)(a) and (C), 1110(A)(introductory
3	paragraph), (2), (4), (5), and (7) and (E), 1116(A)(introductory paragraph) and (2),
4	(B)(introductory paragraph) and (1), and 1118 and to repeal R.S. 37:1103(12) and
5	1120, relative to licensed marriage and family therapists; to provide for an additional
6	member to the Licensed Professional Counselors Board of Examiners; to provide for
7	denial, revocation, or suspension of a licensee; to provide for changes to licensure
8	application for marriage and family therapists; to provide for changes for reciprocity
9	licensure; and to provide for related matters.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. R.S. 37:1104(A), (B)(1) and (2)(a) and (C), 1110(A)(introductory
12	paragraph), (2), (4), (5), and (7) and (E), 1116(A)(introductory paragraph) and (2),
13	(B)(introductory paragraph) and (1), and 1118 are hereby amended and reenacted to read as
14	follows:
15	§1104. Louisiana Licensed Professional Counselors Board of Examiners
16	A. There is hereby created in the Department of Health and Hospitals the
17	Louisiana Licensed Professional Counselors Board of Examiners, hereafter referred
18	to as the "board", consisting of ten eleven members who shall be residents of the
19	state of Louisiana. Each term shall be for four years. Seven appointments to the
20	board, including one individual from the public at large, shall be made by the
21	governor from a list of qualified candidates submitted by the executive board of the
22	Louisiana Counseling Association. Three Four appointments to the board shall be
23	made by the governor from a list of qualified candidates submitted by the executive
24	board of the Louisiana Association for Marriage and Family Therapy. Each
25	appointment by the governor shall be submitted to the Senate for confirmation.

B.(1) The membership of the board shall consist of three licensed professional counselors, three educators who are licensed professional counselors and whose function is the training of mental health counselors in accredited programs, three four licensed marriage and family therapists, and one individual from the public at large. The professional membership of the board shall be licensed under this Chapter. The board shall perform such duties and exercise such powers as this Chapter prescribes and confers upon it. No member of the board shall be liable in any civil action for any act performed in good faith in the execution of his duties under this Chapter.

(2)(a) The board shall establish a Marriage and Family Therapy Advisory Committee, which shall consist of the three four licensed marriage and family therapist board members appointed by the governor from a list of names submitted by the executive board of the Louisiana Association for Marriage and Family Therapy.

C. No board member shall serve more than two full consecutive terms. Any board member may be removed by the governor or majority vote of the board, after notice and hearing, for incompetence, neglect of duty, malfeasance in office, or moral turpitude. Any vacancy occurring in board membership for the three licensed professional counselors, three counselor educators, or one member of the public at large, other than by expiration of term, shall be filled appointed for the remainder of the unexpired term by the governor within thirty days from a list of qualified candidates supplied by the executive board of the Louisiana Counseling Association. Any vacancy occurring in board membership for the three four licensed marriage and family therapists, other than by expiration of term, shall be filled appointed for the remainder of the unexpired term by the governor within thirty days from a list of qualified candidates supplied by the executive board of the Louisiana Association for Marriage and Family Therapy.

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1	§1110. Denial, revocation, or suspension of license
2	A. The board shall withhold, deny, revoke, or suspend any license issued or
3	applied for in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter or otherwise discipline
4	a licensed professional counselor licensee upon proof that the applicant or licensed
5	professional counselor <u>licensee</u> :
6	* * *
7	(2) Has been convicted in a court of competent jurisdiction of any crime or
8	offense which reflects the inability of the practitioner to practice mental health
9	counseling with due regard for the health and safety of clients or patients.
10	* * *
11	(4) Is abusing drugs or alcohol to an extent or in a manner dangerous to any
12	other person or the public, or to an extent that said use impairs his ability to perform
13	the work of a licensed professional counselor <u>licensee</u> .
14	(5) Has impersonated another person holding a professional mental health
15	counselor license issued pursuant to this Chapter or allowed another person to use
16	his license.
17	* * *
18	(7) Has allowed his name or license issued under this Chapter to be used in
19	connection with any person or persons who perform mental health counseling
20	services practice outside of the area of their training, experience, or competence.
21	* * *
22	E. The board is authorized to suspend the license of a licensed professional
23	counselor licensee for a period not exceeding two years. At the end of this period,
24	the board shall re-evaluate the suspension and may recommend to the chairman the
25	reinstatement or revocation of the license. A person whose license has been revoked
26	under the provisions of this Section may apply for reinstatement after a period of not
27	less than two years from the date such denial, or revocation is legally effective. The
28	board may, upon favorable action by a majority of the board members present and

voting, recommend such reinstatement.

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§1116. Licensure application for marriage and family therapists

A. Each person desiring to obtain a license as a practicing marriage and family therapist shall make application to the The board shall issue a license to each applicant who files an application upon such forms a form and in such manner as the board prescribes, accompanied by such fee as required by R.S. 37:1106, and shall furnish who furnishes evidence satisfactory to the board and the advisory committee that such person:

* * *

(2) Is not engaged or has not engaged in any practice or conduct which would be grounds for refusing to issue a license. Is not in violation of any provision of this Chapter and the rules and regulations adopted by the board.

* * *

- B. Any person who applies to the board for recommendation for licensure as a marriage and family therapist between January 1, 2003 and June 30, 2004, and who meets the requirements of Subsection A of this Section shall be recommended by the advisory committee to the board for issuance of a license upon providing satisfactory evidence to the advisory committee that such person meets the following education and experience requirements:
- (1) An appropriate graduate degree in an allied mental health discipline as defined by the board upon recommendation of the advisory committee from a regionally accredited institution so recognized at the time of the granting of such degree.
- (2) At least two years of supervised clinical experience in the practice of marriage and family therapy.
- C. Any person who applies to the board for licensure as a marriage and family therapist after June 30, 2004, and An applicant who meets the requirements of Subsection A of this Section shall be recommended by the advisory committee to the board for issuance of a license by the board upon providing satisfactory evidence to the advisory committee that such person meets the following education and experience requirements:

1 (1) Successful completion of one of the following educational requirements: 2 (a) A master's degree or a doctoral degree in marriage and family therapy 3 from a recognized educational institution as defined in R.S. 37:1103(12) or a 4 graduate degree in an allied field from a recognized educational institution as defined in R.S. 37:1103(12) and graduate level coursework which is equivalent to a master's 5 6 degree in marriage and family therapy and is evidenced by certified transcripts 7 demonstrating completion of coursework in the following areas: a program in a 8 regionally accredited educational institution accredited by the Commission on 9 Accreditation for Marriage and Family Therapy Education or a certificate from a 10 postgraduate training institute in marriage and family therapy accredited by the 11 Commission on Accreditation for Marriage and Family Therapy Education. 12 (b) A master's or doctoral degree in marriage and family therapy or a related 13 clinical mental health field from a regionally accredited institution of higher education with course work that includes practicum and internship work in marriage 14 15 and family therapy determined by the advisory committee to be substantially 16 equivalent to a graduate degree in marriage and family therapy from a program 17 accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Marriage and Family Therapy 18 Education. 19 (c) A certificate from a postgraduate training institute in marriage and family 20 therapy with course work that includes practicum and internship work determined 21 by the advisory committee to be substantially equivalent to a graduate degree in 22 marriage and family therapy from a program accredited by the Commission on 23 Accreditation for Marriage and Family Therapy Education. 24 (d) A masters degree or a doctoral degree in marriage and family therapy 25 from a regionally accredited institution of higher education whose program and 26 cirriculum was approved by the board through the advisory committee at anytime 27 prior to July 1, 2010, and the applicant for licensure has at least five hundred hours 28 of client contact, and where the client contact shall include all of the following: 29 (i) Two hundred and fifty hours of relational therapy.

(ii) One hundred hours in which the applicant has been subjected to qualified supervision as is defined in R.S. 37:1103 (11).

(a) Two or three semester courses, each course consisting of at least three hours, in Marriage and Family Therapy Foundations which includes coursework in the following areas: historical development, theoretical and empirical foundations, and contemporary conceptual directions of the field of marriage and family therapy. These areas shall provide a comprehensive survey and substantive understanding of the major models of marriage and family therapy. Students should be able to conceptualize and distinguish the critical epistemological issues in the profession of marriage and family therapy. If the applicant has five Marriage and Family Clinical Practice semester courses, each course consisting of at least three hours, then he is required only to obtain two semester courses in Marriage and Family Therapy Foundations.

- (b) Four or five semester courses, each course consisting of at least three hours, in Marriage and Family Therapy Clinical Practice which includes coursework, at a minimum, in the following areas: relational and systematic perspectives, psychopharmacology, physical health and illness, traditional psychodiagnostic categories, the assessment and treatment of major health issues and a wide variety of presenting problems.
- (c) Two semester courses, each course consisting of at least three hours, in Individual Development and Family Relations which includes coursework in the following areas: individual development across the lifespan and family development across the lifespan.
- (d) One semester course consisting of at least three hours in Professional Identity and Ethics which includes coursework in the following areas: professional identity, professional socialization, scope of practice, membership in professional organizations, licensure, and certification, confidentiality issues, legal and ethical responsibilities of the profession, and recordkeeping. A generic course in ethics does not meet this requirement:

(e) One semester course consisting of at least three hours in Marriage and
Family Therapy Research which includes coursework in the following areas:
research in marriage and family therapy while addressing research methodology,
data analysis, and the evaluation of both quantitative and qualitative methods.

(f) One semester course consisting of at least three hours in additional

- (f) One semester course consisting of at least three hours in additional learning relevant to the field of Marriage and Family Therapy which includes course work that augments student's specialized interest and background in individual and family therapy. The course work may be selected from a variety of disciplines.
- (2) Successful completion of two calendar years of work experience in marriage and family therapy under qualified supervision as defined in R.S. 37:1103(11) following receipt of a qualifying degree.
 - (3) Passage of an examination administered by the board.

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§1118. Provisional and reciprocal Reciprocal licenses for marriage and family therapists

A. The advisory committee may develop rules and regulations to provide for recommendation to the board for the issuance of provisional licenses as marriage and family therapists for up to one year to those persons who have filed an application for licensure while such application is being processed by the board or while the applicant is waiting for the opportunity to take the first examination offered by the board after filing his application.

B. The board shall issue, upon recommendation of the advisory committee, a license to any person who has been licensed or certified as a marriage and family therapist for at least five years in another state whose requirements for the license or certificate are equivalent to or exceed the requirements of this state, province, territorial possession of the United States, District of Columbia, or Commonwealth of Puerto Rico and has passed the Association of Marital and Family Therapy Regulatory Board's examination in Marital and Family Therapy, provided the applicant submits an application on forms prescribed by the board and upon payment of the required licensure fee.

B. The board shall issue, upon recommendation of the advisory committee, 2 a license to any person licensed as a marriage and family therapist for less than five 3 years in another state, province, territorial possession of the United States, District 4 of Columbia, or Commonwealth of Puerto Rico whose requirements for the license 5 are substantially equivalent to or exceed the requirements of this state, provided the 6 applicant submits an application on forms prescribed by the board and upon payment 7 of the required licensure fee. 8 Section 2.
