TEACHERS/EVALUATION: Provides relative to teacher evaluations

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 17:3883(A)(6) and to enact R.S. 17:3902.1, relative to
3	elementary and secondary education; to provide relative to the evaluation of teachers
4	and administrators; to require the appointment and convening of an advisory
5	subcommittee to make specific recommendations relative to such evaluation; to
6	provide a time line for the convening of the subcommittee and for the submission of
7	recommendations; to provide relative to the membership of the subcommittee; to
8	provide for effectiveness; and to provide for related matters.
9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
0	Section 1. R.S. 17:3883(A)(6) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 17:3902.1
1	is hereby enacted to read as follows:
12	§3883. State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education; powers and duties
13	A. The board shall:

15	(6)(a) Require the state superintendent of education to appoint and convene
16	an Educator Evaluation Advisory Committee Accountability Commission
17	established by the board to convene an advisory subcommittee of the commission to
18	report on and make recommendations to the board regarding the overall effectiveness
19	of the evaluation program, including but not limited to any recommendations for
20	changes to board policy or state law with respect to the development of a value-

added assessment model as determined by the board pursuant to R.S. 17:3902(B)(5),
the identification of measures of student growth for grades and subjects for which
value-added data is are not available and for personnel for whom value-added data
is are not available as established by the board pursuant to R.S. 17:3902(B)(5), and
the adoption of elements of evaluation and standards of for effectiveness as defined
by the board pursuant to R.S. 17:3902(B)(introductory paragraph). The membership
of the advisory committee shall be approved by the board, and at least fifty percent
of the membership shall be comprised of practicing classroom educators. The
advisory committee shall include but not be limited to at least two parents of public
school students and the following groups or organizations as follows: The
subcommittee shall have the following members:
(i) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Associated
Professional Educators speaker of Louisiana the House of Representatives.
(ii) One member of the Senate appointed by the Louisiana Association
president of Educators the Senate.
(iii) One member appointed by the Louisiana Federation of Teachers. At
least six members who are public school teachers. The speaker of the House of
Representatives and the president of the Senate shall each appoint three teachers and
shall collaborate in making their appointments to ensure that the following
requirements are met:
(aa) Two of the teachers shall teach students in grades three, four, or five;
two shall teach students in grades six, seven, or eight; and two shall teach students
in grades nine, ten, eleven, or twelve.
(bb) All of the teachers shall teach subjects for which value-added data are
available.
(cc) One teacher shall be appointed from each congressional district of the
state.
(iv) One member appointed by the Louisiana Association of School
Superintendents. Each member of the Accountability Commission.

1	(v) One member appointed by the Louisiana Association of Principals.
2	(vi) One member appointed by the Louisiana Association of Public Charter
3	Schools.
4	(vii) Two members of the Senate Committee on Education, appointed by the
5	chairman thereof.
6	(viii) Two members of the House Committee on Education, appointed by the
7	chairman thereof.
8	(ix) One member appointed by each member of the State Board of
9	Elementary and Secondary Education.
10	(b) The members of the committee subcommittee shall serve without
11	compensation.
12	(c) The initial meeting of the committee subcommittee shall be held not later
13	than September 30, 2010 <u>2014</u> .
14	(d) The committee subcommittee shall submit its initial report and
15	recommendations to the board and the Senate and House committees on education
16	by not later than April 30, 2012 sixty days prior to the beginning of the 2015 Regular
17	Session of the Legislature of Louisiana and shall submit a subsequent report and
18	further recommendations by not later than sixty days prior to the beginning of the
19	2016 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana.

21	§3902.1. The Teacher Effectiveness and Measurement (TEAM) system;
22	development; teacher education programs
23	A. Each school board may develop and implement the Teacher Effectiveness
24	and Measurement (TEAM) system to support the effectiveness of teachers and
25	administrators.
26	B. The TEAM system, at a minimum, shall require every teacher and
27	administrator to:
28	(1) Apply the components of effective teaching as prescribed by the state
29	board.

1	(2) Demonstrate knowledge of cognitive development stages appropriate for
2	their grade and subject area.
3	(3) Engage in curriculum reading and interfacing specific content to student
4	cognitive growth.
5	(4) Engage in ongoing training and practice in testing and measurement of
6	student achievement.
7	(5) Demonstrate the ability to perform data analysis of norm-referenced and
8	criterion-referenced tests.
9	C. The TEAM system shall require each school board to provide in-service
10	training regarding team building, collaboration, fostering parent-teacher
11	relationships, and laws governing teacher and administrator professional behavior.
12	D. Every teacher and administrator employed by a school board that has
13	developed and implemented the TEAM system shall be provided with an electronic
14	teacher portfolio to support and facilitate the evaluation process.
15	E. The TEAM system shall provide for peer assistance teams which support
16	teachers and administrators in key professional areas, including but not limited to
17	curriculum development, development of critical thinking skills, and effective
18	student assessment.
19	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
20	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
21	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
22	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
23	effective on the day following such approval.

Abstract: Requires the convening of an advisory subcommittee of the Accountability Commission to report on and make recommendations relative to the evaluation of teachers and administrators and authorizes school boards to develop and implement

the Teacher Effectiveness and Measurement (TEAM) system to support teacher and administrator effectiveness.

Advisory subcommittee

Convening

<u>Present law</u> requires the annual, formal evaluation of public school teachers and administrators through the professional employee evaluation program and requires the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) to require the state superintendent to appoint and convene an Educator Evaluation Advisory Committee (EEAC) for the purpose of making recommendations relative to such program.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires BESE to require the BESE-established Accountability Commission to convene an advisory subcommittee of the commission to report on and make recommendations relative to such program.

Recommendations and reports

<u>Present law</u> requires the EEAC to make recommendations to BESE and the House and Senate education committees by April 30, 2012, regarding the development of a value-added assessment model (commonly known as VAM), the identification of measures of student growth for grades and subjects for which value-added data are not available and for personnel for which value-added data are not available, and the adoption of standards of effectiveness.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the Accountability Commission subcommittee to report on and make recommendations regarding the overall effectiveness of the evaluation program, including but not limited to any recommendations for changes to BESE policy or <u>present law</u> relative to VAM, student growth measures, elements of evaluation, and standards of effectiveness. Requires the subcommittee to hold its first meeting by Sept. 30, 2014, and to submit its initial report by not later than 60 days prior to the 2015 R.S. Requires a subsequent report by not later than 60 days prior to the 2016 R.S.

<u>Membership</u>

<u>Present law</u> requires the following membership for the EEAC: at least 50% practicing classroom educators; at least two parents of public school students; two members of each legislative education committee appointed by the respective chairmen; one member appointed by each BESE member; and one member appointed by the Associated Professional Educators of La., La. Assoc. of Educators, La. Federation of Teachers, La. Assoc. of School Superintendents, La. Assoc. of Principals, and La. Assoc. of Public Charter Schools.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the Accountability Commission subcommittee to have the following members:

- (1) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the House speaker.
- (2) One member of the Senate appointed by the Senate president.
- (3) At least six members who are public school teachers; requires the House speaker and Senate president to each appoint three teachers and collaborate to ensure that the following requirements are met:
 - (a) Two shall teach grades three, four, or five; two shall teach grades six, seven, or eight; and two shall teach grades nine, 10, 11, or 12.

- (b) All shall teach subjects for which value-added data are available.
- (c) One shall be appointed from each congressional district of the state.
- (4) Each member of the Accountability Commission.

Compensation

<u>Present law</u> provides for the EEAC members to serve without compensation. <u>Proposed law</u> provides the same for the Accountability Commission subcommittee members.

Teacher Effectiveness and Measurement (TEAM) system

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes school boards to develop and implement the Teacher Effectiveness and Measurement (TEAM) system to support teacher and administrator effectiveness. Further provides that the TEAM system, at a minimum, shall require teachers and administrators to apply the components of effective teaching as prescribed by BESE; demonstrate knowledge of cognitive development stages appropriate for their grade and subject area; engage in curriculum reading and interfacing specific content to student cognitive growth; engage in ongoing training and practice in testing and measurement of student achievement; demonstrate the ability to perform data analysis of norm-referenced and criterion-referenced tests.

Proposed law also provides the following:

- (1) The requirements that the TEAM system:
 - (a) Require each school board to provide in-service training regarding team building, collaboration, fostering parent-teacher relationships, and laws governing teacher and administrator professional behavior.
 - (b) Provide for peer assistance teams which support teachers and administrators in key professional areas, including curriculum development, development of critical thinking skills, and effective student assessment.
- (2) The requirement that teachers and administrators employed by a school board that has implemented the TEAM system be provided with an electronic teacher portfolio to support and facilitate the evaluation process.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

(Amends R.S. 17:3883(A)(6); Adds R.S. 17:3902.1)

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Education</u> to the <u>original</u> bill.

- 1. Adds the requirement that BESE require the BESE-established Accountability Commission to convene an advisory subcommittee of the commission to report on and make recommendations relative to teacher and administrator evaluation.
- 2. Instead of requiring BESE to develop and implement the Teacher Effectiveness and Measurement (TEAM) system to be used by school boards to measure teacher and administrator effectiveness, authorizes school boards to develop and implement such system to support such effectiveness.
- 3. Deletes the following proposed law:

- (a) Requirement that the school and district accountability system be based on multiple indicators of student growth and achievement from multiple data sources as provided in the TEAM system instead of on a value-added assessment model.
- (b) Requirement that a second evaluation be performed within the next school year following a teacher's "ineffective" rating and provision that if the teacher receives a second "ineffective" rating, the local board is authorized rather than required to initiate termination proceedings.
- (c) Prohibition against the evaluation of teachers and administrators based primarily upon the results of a single test.
