1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 26:598, relative to local option elections in a municipality; to authorize the
3	governing authority of a municipality to hold an election for a proposal to allow a
4	restaurant to sell alcohol; to provide for definitions; to provide for the election; and
5	to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 26:598 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
8	§598. Alcoholic beverage sales in restaurants; authorization for propositions to be
9	submitted to voters in certain elections
10	A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, in a
11	municipality having a population of not less than two thousand eight hundred eighty
12	and not more than two thousand nine hundred fifty according to the latest federal
13	decennial census, the governing authority may submit to the voters in any election
14	held in compliance with provisions of R.S. 18:402, a proposition to determine
15	whether or not the business of selling alcoholic beverages in a restaurant may be
16	conducted and licensed only within the incorporated limits of the municipality.
17	B. As used in this Section, the following words shall have the following
18	meanings:
19	(1) "Alcoholic beverages" means any fluid or any solid capable of being
20	converted into fluid, suitable for human consumption, and containing more than one-
21	half of one percent alcohol by volume, including malt, vinous, spirituous, alcoholic
22	or intoxicating liquors, beer, porter, ale, stout, fruit juices, cider, or wine.
23	(2) "Beverages of high alcoholic content" means alcoholic beverages
24	containing more than six percent alcohol by volume.

1	(5) Beverages of low alcoholic content means alcoholic beverages
2	containing not more than six percent alcohol by volume.
3	(4) "Restaurant establishment" means an establishment that meets all of
4	these requirements:
5	(a) Operates a place of business whose average monthly revenue from food
6	and nonalcoholic beverages exceeds fifty percent of its total average monthly
7	revenue from the sale of food, nonalcoholic beverages, and alcoholic beverages.
8	(b) Serves food on all days of operation.
9	(c) Maintains separate sales figures for alcoholic beverages.
10	(d) Operates a fully equipped kitchen used for the preparation of uncooked
11	foods for service and consumption of such foods on the premises.
12	(e) Has a public habitable floor area of no less than five hundred square feet.
13	C.(1) The governing authority of the municipality may order a referendum
14	election to be held within the municipality after an ordinance or resolution of the
15	governing authority is passed authorizing such an election.
16	(2) The governing authority shall not have to comply with the other
17	provisions required by the provisions of this Chapter such as but not limited to the
18	requirement of filing a petition of not less than twenty-five percent of the qualified
19	electors residing in the incorporated municipality with the registrar of voters.
20	(3) When such election has been ordered by the governing authority of the
21	municipality, the following proposition, and no other, shall be submitted to the voters
22	of the municipality:
23	"Shall the sale of beverages of high and low alcoholic content be permitted
24	only on the premises of restaurant establishments which have been issued an "R"
25	permit as defined by law within the corporation limits of the town of"
26	(4) In an election, a majority vote cast on the proposition shall determine the
27	issue for the incorporated municipality and only residents of the incorporated
28	municipality shall be allowed to vote.

1 (5) The governing authority calling the election shall promulgate the result
2 of the election by resolution or ordinance adopted at its first regular meeting after the
3 election and shall publish it in the official journal of the parish.
4 D. All other statutory provisions and rules and regulations of the office of
5 alcohol and tobacco, such as but not limited to application procedures, qualifications,
6 and all licensing and permit requirements for a restaurant "R" permit shall apply.
