COMMENDATIONS: Commends parties which contributed to the successful implementation of a statewide effort to end nonmedically indicated elective deliveries before 39 weeks gestation known as the "39 Week Initiative"

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To commend the Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals, the Louisiana Hospital
3	Association, the Louisiana State Medical Society, the Louisiana Chapter of the
4	American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, the March of Dimes, and all
5	participating hospitals for successful implementation of a statewide effort to end
6	nonmedically indicated elective deliveries prior to thirty-nine weeks gestation.
7	WHEREAS, elective nonmedically indicated deliveries prior to thirty-nine weeks
8	gestation can harm both mothers and babies; and
9	WHEREAS, complications resulting from such elective deliveries include increased
10	admissions to neonatal intensive care units (NICUs), increased respiratory distress
11	syndrome, increased ventilator support, and other transition issues; and
12	WHEREAS, in an effort to support a statewide culture of quality and safety in
13	Louisiana's labor and delivery units, the Department of Health and Hospitals undertook an
14	effort known as the "39 Week Initiative" to end nonmedically indicated deliveries prior to
15	thirty-nine weeks gestation; and
16	WHEREAS, this initiative was a cross-departmental and multiorganizational effort
17	focused on a collective passion for improving birth outcomes; and
18	WHEREAS, the Louisiana Hospital Association, the Louisiana State Medical
19	Society, the Louisiana Medical Mutual Insurance Company, and the Louisiana Chapter of

1	the American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists were vital participants in this
2	initiative; and
3	WHEREAS, in July of 2011, the following fourteen of Louisiana's top birthing
4	hospitals joined this initiative and created teams of nurses, administrators, and physicians
5	who worked together to implement a quality improvement effort including a thirty-nine
6	week policy:
7	(1) CHRISTUS St. Frances Cabrini Hospital.
8	(2) East Jefferson General Hospital.
9	(3) Lafayette General Medical Center.
10	(4) Lakeview Regional Medical Center.
11	(5) Ochsner Medical Center.
12	(6) Touro Infirmary.
13	(7) Women's and Children's Hospital, a campus of the Regional Medical Center of
14	Acadiana.
15	(8) Rapides Regional Medical Center.
16	(9) Baton Rouge General Medical Center.
17	(10) North Oaks Medical Center.
18	(11) St. Tammany Parish Hospital.
19	(12) Terrebone General Medical Center.
20	(13) Willis Knighton South and the Center for Women's Health.
21	(14) Woman's Hospital; and
22	WHEREAS, the above-listed hospitals thereafter reduced elective deliveries from an
23	average of fifteen percent to an average of seven percent and had a corresponding reduction
24	in NICU admissions; and
25	WHEREAS, by December of 2011, each of the state's fifty-eight birthing hospitals
26	had joined the 39 Week Initiative by pledging to implement a thirty-nine-week policy in
27	their labor and delivery units; and
28	WHEREAS, special recognition is due to the March of Dimes and their national
29	"Healthy Babies are Worth the Wait" campaign to end nonmedically indicated deliveries
30	prior to thirty-nine weeks; and

WHEREAS, national and state leaders of the March of Dimes have been invaluable

2 partners in the 39 Week Initiative.

3	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
4	commend the Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals, the Louisiana Hospital
5	Association, the Louisiana State Medical Society, the Louisiana Medical Mutual Insurance
6	Company, the Louisiana Chapter of the American Congress of Obstetricians and
7	Gynecologists, the March of Dimes, and all participating hospitals for successful
8	implementation of a statewide effort to end nonmedically indicated elective deliveries prior
9	to thirty-nine weeks gestation known as the 39 Week Initiative.
