HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4

BY REPRESENTATIVE NORTON

JOINT RULES: Requires plain language in constitutional amendment ballot language

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 To adopt Joint Rule No. 5 of the Joint Rules of the Senate and House of Representatives to
3 require clear, concise, and unbiased language in constitutional amendment ballot
4 language and to require such ballot language to be phrased in the form of a question.

5 BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature of Louisiana that Joint Rule No. 5 of the Joint
6 Rules of the Senate and House of Representatives is hereby adopted to read as follows:

7 Joint Rule No. 5. Constitutional amendment ballot language

8 All ballot language for constitutional amendments shall be drafted in clear,
9 concise, and unbiased language and be phrased in the form of a question. The ballot
10 language shall begin with the phrase "Do you support an amendment to".

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the provisions of this Concurrent Resolution shall
12 become effective on July 1, 2011.
