



1           WHEREAS, the state should be an exemplary employer when it comes to providing  
2 employment opportunities for veterans so as to ensure that those who have made sacrifices  
3 do not continue to do so while their skills and experiences go underutilized in the labor  
4 market; and

5           WHEREAS, providing job interviews to all veterans is one way to ensure that those  
6 individuals have the opportunity to demonstrate their knowledge and abilities to potential  
7 employers and to find meaningful and rewarding careers.

8           THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby  
9 urge and request the State Civil Service Commission to adopt a rule requiring all state  
10 government employers to grant interviews to all job applicants who are veterans of the  
11 United States Armed Services.

12           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the commission shall report to the House Special  
13 Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs and the Senate Select Committee on Military  
14 and Veterans Affairs on the number of veterans interviewed and the number of classified and  
15 unclassified positions filled by veterans prior to the 2021 and 2022 Regular Sessions of the  
16 Legislature.
