A RESOLUTION

To commend James Edward "Jimmy" Fitzmorris, Jr., for a lifetime of remarkable achievements on the memorable occasion of his ninetieth birthday.

WHEREAS, it was a day of great celebration on November 15, 1921, when James Edward "Jimmy" Fitzmorris, Jr., took his first breath as the son of James and Romolia Fitzmorris; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Fitzmorris is held in the highest esteem as a gentleman who has fully used every opportunity to serve his fellow citizens in an honorable and dedicated manner as a two-term lieutenant governor, twelve-year member of the New Orleans City Council, one of the pioneers of the development of the Louisiana Superdome, and longtime board member at Mount Carmel Academy, to name just a few of the many hats he has worn in his long and extremely productive life and career; and

WHEREAS, upon his retirement after thirty years of public service, he formed Fitzmorris and Associates, Inc., where he still puts in a full day of work as president and chief executive officer; and
