4	Henderson, of Winnsboro, Louisiana.
5	WHEREAS, it is with profound sadness that the members of the House of
6	Representatives have learned of the death of United States Army Chief Warrant Officer
7	Bryan James Henderson, who was killed in the service of his country on March 11, 2013,
8	in Afghanistan; and
9	WHEREAS, on June 29, 1985, Jimmy and Kim Henderson proudly welcomed the
10	arrival of their newborn son, Bryan James Henderson, to Monroe, Louisiana; and
11	WHEREAS, growing up with a love of the outdoors, young Bryan hunted, fished,
12	skied, scuba dived, and camped, all of which served as preparation for the rigors of military
13	life; and
14	WHEREAS, Bryan Henderson graduated from Winnsboro High School and
15	completed his secondary education at the University of Louisiana at Monroe in 2006,
16	graduating with a bachelor of science degree in aviation; and

WHEREAS, heeding the call of his country, Bryan Henderson enlisted in the United States Army in 2007, where he immediately went to work, attached to the 4th Battalion, 3rd Aviation Regiment, 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division based at Hunter Army Airfield in Georgia; and

WHEREAS, Chief Warrant Officer Henderson served the United States Army with great courage and valor as evidenced by his receipt of two Army Commendation medals, the Army Achievement Medal, the National Defense Service Medal, the Afghanistan Campaign Medal with a Bronze Service Star, the Iraq Campaign Medal with a Bronze Service Star, the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, the Army Service Ribbon Overseas, the Service Ribbon NATO Medal, the Army Meritorious Unit Commendation, the Overseas Service Bar, and the Posthumous Combat Action Badge; and

WHEREAS, Chief Warrant Officer Henderson was a front-line fighter in the war on terrorism, a soldier in Operation Enduring Freedom who was on his second deployment and was a pilot onboard the helicopter which tragically crashed and ended his life in its twenty-seventh year; and


