HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 149

SCHOOLS/BOARDS: Requests that the State Bd. of Elementary and Secondary Education reconsider its decision to close Benjamin E. Mays Preparatory School and that the Orleans Parish School Board and Recovery School District study working collaboratively to provide education services to this school's students

1 A RESOLUTION

2 To urge and request the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to reconsider
3 its decision to close Benjamin E. Mays Preparatory School in New Orleans and to
4 urge and request the Orleans Parish School Board and the Recovery School District
5 to study jointly the feasibility of working collaboratively to continue to provide
6 education services to the students of this school in the Desire community.

7 WHEREAS, founded in 2009, Benjamin E. Mays Preparatory School is a college
8 preparatory, open-enrollment charter school located on Higgins Boulevard in the Desire
9 community of New Orleans; and

10 WHEREAS, the school's mission is to prepare every student for success in high
11 school, college, and beyond; and

12 WHEREAS, the school subscribes to six essential core values: hard work, excellence,
13 respect, discipline, determination, and leadership; and

14 WHEREAS, in November of 2012, the state Department of Education and the
15 Recovery School District recommended that the school's charter contract not be extended
16 beyond the 2012-2013 school year, and in December of 2012, the State Board of Elementary
17 and Secondary Education approved this recommendation; and

18 WHEREAS, though it has only been open a few years, this unique school has
19 evolved into a true neighborhood institution that is deeply beloved by its students, faculty,
20 and staff and by the Desire community as a whole; and

1 WHEREAS, the closure of this school will disperse hundreds of students and disrupt
2 their educations; and

3 WHEREAS, there is both a strong need and strong community support for keeping
4 Benjamin E. Mays Preparatory School open in order to meet the needs of its students, their
5 parents, and the Desire community; and

6 WHEREAS, it is appropriate and necessary that the State Board of Elementary and
7 Secondary Education revisit its decision to close Benjamin E. Mays Preparatory School and
8 that the Orleans Parish School Board and the Recovery School District collaborate in the
9 effort to provide education services to this school's students.

10 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the
11 Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the State Board of Elementary and
12 Secondary Education to reconsider its decision to close Benjamin E. Mays Preparatory
13 School in New Orleans.

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Louisiana House of Representatives does
15 hereby urge and request the Orleans Parish School Board and the Recovery School District
16 to study jointly the feasibility of working collaboratively to continue to provide education
17 services to the students of this school in the Desire community and to submit jointly a
18 written report of findings and conclusions to the House Committee on Education not later
19 than July 15, 2013.

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted
21 to the president of the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, to the
22 superintendent of the Recovery School District, to the state superintendent of education, and
23 to the president of the Orleans Parish School Board.
