7	current development patterns, dominated by what some call "sprawl", are no longer in the		
8	long-term interest of our cities, existing suburbs, small towns, or rural communities; and		
9	WHEREAS, Louisiana needs to have policies and recommendations in place that will		
10	help communities plan, develop, recover, and grow in ways to enhance community livability		
11	and sustainability and to aid in creating more economic development opportunities; and		
12	WHEREAS, Louisiana land use planners and leaders in areas across the state need		
13	more guidance and understanding of key growth and land use issues.		
14	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the		
15	Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the House Committee on Municipal,		
16	Parochial and Cultural Affairs to study and make recommendations relative to issues related
