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HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 89

LABOR DEPARTMENT: Directs the Louisiana Workforce Commission to develop and present the final version of the Community Service Block Grant state plan to the House Committee on Municipal, Parochial and Cultural Affairs prior to submission to the United States Department of Health and Human Services for approval

A RESOLUTION

2	To direct the Louisiana Workforce Commission to develop and present the final version of
3	the Community Service Block Grant state plan to the House Committee on
4	Municipal, Parochial and Cultural Affairs prior to submission to the United States
5	Department of Health and Human Services, Administration of Children and
6	Families, Office of Community Services, for approval.
7	WHEREAS, the Community Service Block Grant (CSBG), awarded by the United
8	States Department of Health and Human Services, Administration of Children and Families,
9	Office of Community Services (DHHS-ACF-OCS), is the federal government's only
10	antipoverty program administered within the local communities by community action
11	agencies; and
12	WHEREAS, the pending federal budget for CSBG substantially considers
13	performance and innovative initiatives in determining the state allocations on a competitive
14	basis; and
15	WHEREAS, Louisiana Revised Statutes 23:61 through 23:66 provide state statutory
16	authority for the executive director of the Louisiana Workforce Commission to administer
17	the CSBG for the state of Louisiana; and
18	WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 676 of the CSBG legislation (Public Law 105-285-
19	October 27, 1998), at least one legislative hearing must be held every three years in
20	conjunction with the development of the state plan; and

1	WHEREAS, the Louisiana Workforce Commission (LWC) failed to comply with this
2	requirement and submitted the current CSBG state plan to DHHS-ACF-OCS despite
3	knowledge that the previous legislative hearing occurred beyond the three-year mandate, on
4	August 27, 2007; and
5	WHEREAS, the Louisiana Legislative Auditor cited multiple significant findings
6	regarding the LWC's administration and implementation deficiencies of the CSBG program
7	in his most recent audit, dated March 16, 2011; and
8	WHEREAS, the LWC recently returned \$1,413,434 to the federal government that
9	was intended for investment in CSBG-related initiatives; and
10	WHEREAS, the LWC denied the request of the community action agencies to
11	implement a performance management system designed to enhance the effectiveness,
12	efficiency, responsiveness, and accountability of service delivery to the target population;
13	and
14	WHEREAS, the most recent CSBG Annual Report 2009 from the National
15	Association for State Community Services Programs reflects Louisiana as one of only four
16	states and Puerto Rico choosing not to invest any discretionary funds allocated to support
17	their designated priority categories of community action agency expansion, competitive
18	grants for exemplary programs, training or technical assistance, or statewide programs; and
19	WHEREAS, the CSBG Annual Report 2009 identifies thirty-three authorized staff
20	positions but only seven full-time equivalent positions; and
21	WHEREAS, DHHS-ACF-OCS, recently published Information Memorandum 123,
22	which addresses "A New Strategy for Excellence" necessary for the community action
23	agencies to successfully compete in this new economic climate and for the CSBG to remain
24	viable and which emphasizes the agency's confidence in state associations serving as the
25	training or technical assistance administrators to more effectively increase the capacity of
26	local CSBG-eligible entities to carry out the mandate of the CSBG legislation (Public Law
27	105-285-October 27, 1998) and ensure results are appropriately measured; and
28	WHEREAS, the Louisiana Association of Community Action Partnerships, Inc., the
29	statewide association established to provide customized support and services to community
30	action agencies, has consistently demonstrated success in administering, funding, leveraging

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community resources, and implementing innovative strategies, such as their nationally 2 credentialed state-of-the art weatherization training center, which significantly enhances the 3 quality of life for individuals within the CSBG target population; and 4 WHEREAS, the Louisiana Association of Community Action Partnerships, Inc., has consistently requested the opportunity to serve a greater role and assume greater 5 6 responsibility in the administration and implementation of CSBG, particularly as it is related 7 to training and technical assistance, innovative service delivery strategies, targeting 8 resources based on local needs/outcomes, and risk mitigation to assure appropriate, timely, 9 and effective expenditure of funds; and 10 WHEREAS, the United States Census Bureau's American Community Survey 11 identifies Louisiana's poverty rate as the second-highest among all states in the United 12 States; and 13 WHEREAS, according to Louisiana Executive Order No. BJ 2008-41, the real 14 economic costs resulting from a high rate of poverty are borne by Louisiana's overall 15 population, and negatively affect the state's educational, workforce, and economic 16 development potential; and 17 WHEREAS, the order also states that the most effective strategies for reducing 18 poverty are those that help individuals move from poverty to self-sufficiency through 19 effective educational and workforce supports. 20 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the 21 Legislature of Louisiana does hereby direct the Louisiana Workforce Commission to 22 develop and present the final version of the Community Service Block Grant state plan to 23 the House Committee on Municipal, Parochial and Cultural Affairs prior to submission to 24 the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Administration of Children 25 and Families, Office of Community Services, for approval. 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such plan shall have the purposes of promoting 27 economy and efficiency in the operation and management of the purposes of the CSBG and 28 shall include the most recent guidance outlined in Information Memorandum 123 published 29 by DHHS-ACF-OCS.

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the LWC shall coordinate with the Louisiana 2 Association of Community Action Partnerships, Inc., to develop the CSBG state plan, to 3 develop and implement the most effective service delivery strategy required to meet the 4 outlined criteria, and to more effectively serve the eligible citizens in need. 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the executive director of the LWC shall coordinate with the House Committee on Municipal, Parochial and Cultural Affairs to 6 7 provide quarterly reports and such reports shall include the four priority areas identified in 8 the Information Memorandum 123 and any further guidance from DHHS-ACF-OCS 9 identifying strategies and directives for successful utilization of the CSBG. 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the executive director of the LWC shall submit 11 reports for the preceding quarter to the House Committee on Municipal, Parochial and 12 Cultural Affairs not later than January twentieth, April twentieth, July twentieth, and 13 October twentieth of each year, beginning with the report for the first quarter of 2012, and 14 that a copy thereof shall be submitted to the governor and to the commissioner of 15 administration. 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the House Committee on Municipal, Parochial 17 18

and Cultural Affairs may conduct such hearings as it deems appropriate to review the reports submitted by the LWC and that the LWC shall furnish the committees any information it may request concerning the status and effectiveness of the CSBG.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the executive director of the LWC.

Barrow HR No. 89

Directs the La. Workforce Commission (LWC) to develop and present the final version of the Community Service Block Grant (CSBG) state plan to the House Committee on Municipal, Parochial and Cultural Affairs prior to submission to the U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services, Administration of Children and Families, Office of Community Services, for approval.

Requires the LWC to coordinate with the La. Association of Community Action Partnerships, Inc., to develop the CSBG state plan.

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Requires the LWC to submit quarterly reports on certain priority areas to the House Committee on Municipal, Parochial and Cultural Affairs. Provides dates by which each report is to be submitted.

Provides that the House Committee on Municipal, Parochial and Cultural Affairs may conduct hearings concerning reports from the LWC and the status and effectiveness of the CSBG.
