ATHLETICS: Requests the House Committee on Education to study and report on certain issues and concerns relative to the recruitment of student athletes

2	To the House Committee on Education to study issues and concerns relative to the
3	recruitment of students by both public and nonpublic schools to participate in high
4	school athletics and the enforcement and oversight of school recruitment practices
5	by the Louisiana High School Athletic Association and to report its findings to the
6	House of Representatives prior to the convening of the 2012 Regular Session of the
7	Legislature of Louisiana.
8	WHEREAS, the Louisiana High School Athletic Association (LHSAA) was created
9	to promote, regulate, and direct the interscholastic athletic activities of Louisiana public and
10	nonpublic high schools that are members of the association; and
11	WHEREAS, the constitution adopted by the LHSAA states that its purposes include
12	to protect members of the association by preparing and enforcing eligibility rules that will
13	equalize and stimulate wholesome competition, to prevent the exploitation of member
14	schools' programs by special interest groups, and to preserve the game for the boys and girls
15	and not sacrifice the boys and girls to the game; and
16	WHEREAS, the LHSAA constitution further states that the association is vitally
17	interested in the welfare of every boy and girl participating in its athletic contests and that
18	it is for the protection of their interests that the association operates; and
19	WHEREAS, one way that the association attempts to provide such protection is
20	through its policy relative to the recruitment of students for participation in athletics; and
21	WHEREAS, according to information found on the association's website, the
22	LHSAA "maintains a strict policy against the recruitment of student-athletes for athletic

1 purposes" and considers such recruitment to be "a gross violation of the spirit and

2 philosophy of the LHSAA's constitution and bylaws"; and

WHEREAS, such information further states that coaches are prohibited from using their positions to influence potential student athletes to enroll at or transfer to the school at which they are employed and from having contact with students living outside their schools' attendance zones; and

WHEREAS, there are concerns from interested parties that these policies are being ignored by some schools and that many coaches are in violation of the policies especially with regard to student transfers and contact; and

WHEREAS, there are also some concerns regarding the lack of uniformity in the enforcement of these policies by the LHSAA resulting in unfair competition among schools; and

WHEREAS, in order to ensure that students are not being exploited or taken advantage of and that the purposes of the LHSAA are being fulfilled as intended, especially those relative to protecting students, it is imperative that a study be conducted on these issues and concerns regarding the recruitment of student athletes.

THEREFORE, the House of Representatives of the Legislature of Louisiana requests the House Committee on Education to study issues and concerns relative to the recruitment of students by both public and nonpublic schools to participate in high school athletics and the enforcement and oversight of school recruitment practices by the Louisiana High School Athletic Association and to report its findings to the House of Representatives prior to the convening of the 2012 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana.
