MENTAL HEALTH: Requests the House Committee on Health and Welfare to study potential reforms to this state's system of child and adolescent psychiatric care

1	A STUDY REQUEST
2	To the House Committee on Health and Welfare to study potential reforms to this state's
3	system of child and adolescent psychiatric care which balances costs with adequacy
4	of treatment and to report its findings to the House of Representatives prior to the
5	convening of the 2011 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana.
6	WHEREAS, due to the 2005 hurricanes, the capacity of south Louisiana hospitals
7	to provide child and adolescent psychiatric care was severely diminished, and patients from
8	southern Louisiana were admitted to hospitals in other parts of the state; and
9	WHEREAS, the challenges that families and health care providers faced in having
10	children and adolescents cared for, referred, discharged, and re-admitted to hospitals in their
11	home regions brought to light fundamental flaws in this state's system of care for young
12	people with mental health care needs; and
13	WHEREAS, these flaws essentially result from this state employing a system of
14	managed costs rather than a system of managed care and present an ongoing challenge which
15	affects vulnerable populations in all parts of this state; and
16	WHEREAS, cuts in Medicaid rates for child and adolescent psychiatric care have not
17	been distributed evenly among providers; and
18	WHEREAS, resulting in part from these cuts, the Department of Health and
19	Hospitals (DHH) promulgated rules to establish strict new requirements for child and
20	adolescent psychiatric care, prohibiting any physician with admitting privileges from issuing
21	certificates of need for child and adolescent patients; and

1 WHEREAS, shorter length of stay criteria, which were also part of the new DHH 2 rules, represent an additional barrier to children and adolescents accessing proper psychiatric 3 care; and 4 WHEREAS, in combination, these factors force children and adolescents with mental 5 health needs into outpatient care or no care at all when inpatient care is clearly clinically 6 indicated and necessary; and 7 WHEREAS, overall health care costs are certain to increase due to higher utilization 8 of primary care settings when children and adolescents do not receive adequate psychiatric 9 care. 10 THEREFORE, the House of Representatives of the Legislature of Louisiana requests 11 the House Committee on Health and Welfare to study potential reforms to this state's system 12 of child and adolescent psychiatric care which balances costs with adequacy of treatment and 13 to report its findings to the House of Representatives prior to the convening of the 2011 14 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana.
