1	AN ACT
2	To enact Chapter 15-A of Title 3 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised
3	of R.S. 3:2071 through 2077, and R.S. 36:629(T), relative to the creation of the
4	Louisiana Equine Promotion and Research Program; to create the Louisiana Equine
5	Promotion and Research Advisory Board; to provide for the composition, powers,
6	duties, and functions of the board; to authorize the commissioner of agriculture and
7	forestry to adopt rules and accept certain funds; to provide for the use of funds; to
8	provide for definitions; to provide for transfer of the board to the Department of
9	Agriculture and Forestry; and to provide for related matters.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. Chapter 15-A of Title 3 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950,
12	comprised of R.S. 3:2071 through 2077, is hereby enacted to read as follows:
13	CHAPTER 15-A. LOUISIANA EQUINE PROMOTION AND
14	RESEARCH PROGRAM
15	§2071. Legislative intent
16	The legislature intends by this Chapter to authorize the equine industry
17	to establish a self-governed program to support the growth and development of
18	the industry in Louisiana.
19	§2072. Name and purpose
20	A. The name of the program created and organized by this Chapter shall
21	be the Louisiana Equine Promotion and Research Program.
22	B. The purpose of the program is to support the growth and development
23	of the equine industry in Louisiana by enhancing research, education,
24	promotion, facilities, tourism, events, and equine-related activities throughout
25	the state.

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1	§2073. Definitions
2	As used in this Chapter:
3	(1) "Board" means the Louisiana Equine Promotion and Research
4	Advisory Board.
5	(2) "Commissioner" means the commissioner of agriculture and
6	forestry.
7	(3) "Equine" means all members of the genus Equus, regardless of age,
8	including horses, ponies, mules, donkeys, and zebras.
9	(4) "Equine educational program" means any event focused on
10	improving a participant's understanding of equines.
11	(5) "Equine event" means any kind of show, exposition, contest, or
12	tournament where equines are shown competitively.
13	(6) "Equine facility" means any facility used to host equine events.
14	(7) "Equine industry member" means any person with an interest and
15	background in the requirements of owning, breeding, showing, or managing
16	equines.
17	(8) "Equine performance" means any discipline within the equine
18	industry where equines are used competitively or in exhibition.
19	(9) "Equine research" means any scholarly activity conducted to collect
20	scientific data utilizing experimental design.
21	(10) "Program" means the Louisiana Equine Promotion and Research
22	Program.
23	(11) "Promotion of the equine industry" means the development of a
24	comprehensive marketing plan for the equine industry including a website,
25	social media, and an advertising program that includes all breeds, disciplines,
26	and equine-related activities.
27	(12) "Therapeutic riding and rehabilitation center" means any
28	Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship International (PATH
29	Intl.) accredited program that utilizes equine-assisted activities to contribute
30	positively to the cognitive, physical, and social well-being of individuals.

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1	(13) "Trail facility" means a facility with routes planned specifically for
2	public equine use as well as necessary support areas such as camping facilities.
3	§2074. The Louisiana Equine Promotion and Research Advisory Board;
4	creation and organization
5	A. The Louisiana Equine Promotion and Research Advisory Board is
6	hereby created within the Department of Agriculture and Forestry. The board
7	shall be domiciled in Baton Rouge.
8	B. The board shall consist of thirteen members appointed by the
9	commissioner as follows:
10	(1) One member who is engaged in the equine event business appointed
11	from a list of three persons nominated by the Louisiana Farm Bureau
12	Federation, Inc.
13	(2) One member who is engaged in the trail facility business appointed
14	from a list of three persons nominated by the Louisiana Farm Bureau
15	Federation, Inc.
16	(3) One member who is engaged in equine educational programs from
17	an accredited postsecondary education institution in Louisiana.
18	(4) One member engaged in the promotion of the equine industry
19	appointed from a list of three persons nominated by the Louisiana Farm Bureau
20	Federation, Inc.
21	(5) One member who is engaged in equine research from an accredited
22	postsecondary education institution in Louisiana.
23	(6) Two members who are engaged in equine performance.
24	(7) Two members who are engaged in equine racing.
25	(8) One member who is an owner or operator of a therapeutic riding and
26	rehabilitation center appointed from a list of three persons nominated by the
27	Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation, Inc.
28	(9) One member who is an owner or operator of an equine facility
29	appointed from a list of three persons nominated by the Louisiana Farm Bureau
30	Federation, Inc.

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1	(10) One member appointed from a list of three persons nominated by
2	the Louisiana Quarter Horse Breeder Association.
3	(11) One member appointed from a list of three persons nominated by
4	the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association.
5	C.(1) The commissioner, or his designee, shall serve as an ex officio
6	member in an advisory capacity only.
7	(2) The lieutenant governor, or his designee, shall serve as an ex officio
8	member in an advisory capacity only.
9	(3) The president of Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation, Inc., or his
10	designee, shall serve as an ex officio member in an advisory capacity only.
11	D. Members shall serve at the pleasure of the commissioner and shall
12	serve terms concurrent with the term of the commissioner making the
13	appointment.
14	E. An organization authorized to make nominations for appointment to
15	the board shall submit its list of nominees within thirty days after the
16	commissioner requests the list. The commissioner shall make all appointments
17	to the board no later than thirty days after receiving the list of nominees. The
18	board should be representative of the state's population by race and gender to
19	ensure diversity.
20	F. A vacancy in the office of a member shall be filled in the same manner
21	as the original appointment. Persons appointed to fill vacancies shall serve for
22	the unexpired portion of the vacated term.
23	G. A majority of the members of the board shall constitute a quorum for
24	the transaction of business. All official actions of the board shall require the
25	affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the board present and voting.
26	H. Members of the board shall receive no compensation.
27	I. The board shall meet at least twice a year and may meet at other times
28	on the call of the chairman or any four members.
29	J. The board, by a vote of a majority of the members, may expel a
30	member for good cause shown. Good cause shall include but shall not be limited

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1	to three consecutive unexcused absences. The expulsion of a member creates a
2	vacancy in the office of the expelled member.
3	K. The board shall meet and organize as soon as practicable after
4	appointment of the members, and shall elect a chairman, vice chairman, and
5	secretary-treasurer from the membership of the board, whose duties shall be
6	those customarily exercised by such officers or specifically designated by the
7	board. Officers shall serve a one-year term.
8	§2075. Powers and duties
9	A. The board shall:
10	(1) Advise the commissioner on the development and maintenance of the
11	Louisiana Equine Promotion and Research Program.
12	(2) Maintain a permanent record of its proceedings.
13	(3) Submit an annual report of its activities to the Senate Committee on
14	Agriculture, Forestry, Aquaculture, and Rural Development and the House
15	Committee on Agriculture, Forestry, Aquaculture, and Rural Development by
16	January first of each year.
17	B. The board may:
18	(1) Provide information to governmental entities upon request on
19	subjects of concern to the equine industry and collaborate with the state or
20	federal government on the development and administration of the program.
21	(2) Cooperate with any local, state, regional, or national organization or
22	agency engaged in activities consistent with the objectives of the program.
23	C. The commissioner may:
24	(1) Adopt such rules and regulations as are necessary to administer the
25	program. All rules and regulations shall be adopted in accordance with the
26	Administrative Procedure Act.
27	(2) Enter into contracts or other agreements to accomplish any purpose
28	authorized by this Chapter, including advertising, education, marketing,
29	promotion, research, or services.
30	§2076. Funding

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I	To achieve the purposes of this Chapter, the commissioner may accept
2	and expend monies from any source, including gifts, contributions, donations,
3	state appropriations, and federal grants and may accept and use services from
4	individuals, corporations, and governmental entities.
5	§2077. Use of funds
6	Funds made available to the commissioner shall be expended to
7	effectuate the purposes of this Chapter including but not limited to the following
8	uses:
9	(1) To attract national contests, shows, and equine events to Louisiana.
10	(2) To develop and promote equine tourism through the enhancement of
11	equine trails and camping facilities.
12	(3) To support therapeutic riding and rehabilitation programs.
13	(4) To develop educational programs and disseminate educational
14	materials about the equine industry.
15	(5) To support the enhancement and maintenance of public multi-use
16	equine facilities.
17	(6) To promote activities, facilities, events, and the needs of the Louisiana
18	equine industry.
19	(7) To contract for scientific research with any accredited postsecondary
20	education institution or similar educational institution that will assist in
21	carrying out the purposes of the program, including equine health, welfare,
22	management, reproduction, nutrition, and general physiology.
23	Section 2. R.S. 36:629(T) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
24	§629. Transfer of boards, commissions, departments, and agencies to the
25	Department of Agriculture and Forestry
26	* * *
27	T. The Louisiana Equine Promotion and Research Advisory Board (R.S.
28	3:2071 et seq.) is placed within the Department of Agriculture and Forestry and
29	shall perform and exercise its powers, duties, functions, and responsibilities as
30	provided by law.

Section 3. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 2 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 3 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana.
