CRIME/PUNISHMENT. Constitutional amendment to abolish the death penalty. (2/3 - CA13s1(A))

A JOINT RESOLUTION

2	Proposing to add Article I, Section 28 of the Constitution of Louisiana, relative to capital
3	punishment; to abolish the death penalty as punishment for any offense committed
4	on or after January 1, 2021; and to specify an election for the submission of the
5	proposition to electors and to provide a ballot proposition.
6	Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members
7	elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state, for
8	their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to add Article I,
9	Section 28 of the Constitution of Louisiana to read as follows:
10	§28. Capital punishment prohibited
11	No law shall subject any person to the death penalty as punishment for
12	any offense committed on or after January 1, 2021.
13	Section 2. Be it further resolved that this proposed amendment shall be submitted
14	to the electors of the state of Louisiana at the statewide election to be held on November 3,
15	2020.
16	Section 3. Be it further resolved that on the official ballot to be used at said election
17	there shall be printed a proposition, upon which the electors of the state shall be permitted

to vote YES or NO, to amend the Constitution of Louisiana, which proposition shall read as
follows:

Do you support an amendment to abolish the death penalty as a punishment
for any offense committed on or after January 1, 2021?
