2	To amend and reenact R.S. 47:463.60(B), (C), (D)(introductory paragraph), and (E), and to
3	repeal R.S. 47:463.60(H), relative to special prestige license plates; to provide with
4	respect to the "Animal Friendly" prestige license plate; to provide for a royalty fee;
5	to abolish the Pet Overpopulation Fund; to provide for the transfer of any remaining
6	monies in the Pet Overpopulation Fund; to provide for an effective date; and to
7	provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 47:463.60(B), (C), (D)(introductory paragraph), and (E) are hereby
10	amended and reenacted to read as follows:
11	§463.60. Special prestige license plates; "Animal Friendly" prestige license plate;
12	animal population control; Pet Overpopulation Fund
13	* * *
14	B. The charge annual fee for this prestige license plate shall be a royalty fee
15	of twenty-five dollars to be distributed as provided in this Section and a handling fee
16	of three dollars and fifty cents to be retained by the department to offset a portion of
17	administrative costs. These charges shall be in addition to the standard motor vehicle
18	license tax imposed by Article VII, Section 5 of the Constitution of Louisiana.
19	C. The department shall collect the monies received from the sale of this
20	royalty fee for the prestige license plate and shall forward twenty-five dollars
21	immediately upon receipt to the state treasury. After compliance with the
22	requirements of Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana relative
23	to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund, the monies shall be deposited in the Pet
24	Overpopulation Fund, which is hereby created within the state treasury, and shall be
25	used solely to provide reduced-cost sterilizations of adult animals as defined in R.S.
26	3:2471(2) to indigent pet owners. All unexpended and unencumbered monies
27	remaining in the fund at the close of each fiscal year shall remain in the fund. Monies

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1	in the fund shall be invested by the state treasurer in the same manner as monies in
2	the state general fund. All interest earned from the investment of monies in the fund
3	shall be credited to this fund after compliance with Article VII, Section 9(B) of the
4	Constitution of Louisiana each quarter shall distribute the royalty fee to the Per
5	Overpopulation Advisory Council.
6	D. A Pet Overpopulation Advisory Council is hereby established within the
7	office of the governor to establish guidelines for the expenditure of funds credited
8	to the Pet Overpopulation Fund and to review and make recommendations on gran
9	applications submitted in compliance with Subsection F of this Section. Members
10	of the council shall serve on a voluntary basis and shall not receive any
11	compensation or reimbursement of expenses. The council shall meet at least twice
12	annually, and it shall consist of the following members:

14	E.(1) The Pet Overpopulation Advisory Council shall distribute the
15	monies to qualified entities as provided in this Section. The Pet Overpopulation
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of the effective date of this Act and the state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to

immediately transfer any monies remaining in the Pet Overpopulation Fund to the Escrow

1 Fund. Such monies shall be appropriated or otherwise distributed to the Pet Overpopulation 2 Advisory Council as provided in Section 1 of this Act. 3 Section 4. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 4 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 5 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 6 7 effective on the day following such approval.
