§3997. Charter school employees

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(2) By the beginning of the 2012-2013 **2013-2014** school year, fifty percent of each teacher and administrator evaluation conducted pursuant to Paragraph (1) of this Subsection shall be based on evidence of growth in student achievement using the value-added assessment model as determined by the state board for grade levels and subjects for which value-added data is available. For grade levels and subjects for which value-added data is not available, the state board shall establish measures of student growth. The model shall take into account important student factors, including but not limited to special education, eligibility for free or reduced price meals, student attendance, and student discipline. The state board shall develop and adopt a policy to invalidate such student growth data for any teacher for any school year in which there is a natural disaster or any other unexpected event that results in the temporary closure of the school.

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Section 2. For the 2012-2013 school year, notwithstanding any law, rule, or regulation to the contrary, each city, parish, or other local public school board shall be allowed to utilize the personnel evaluation plans and processes as prescribed by each board's policy on the effective date of Act 54 of the 2010 Regular Session of the Louisiana 1 Legislature.

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Section 3. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.

DIGEST

<u>Present law</u> provides that by the beginning of the 2012-2013 school year, 50% of the annual evaluation of each public school teacher and administrator, including those employed in charter schools, shall be based on evidence of growth in student achievement using a value-added assessment model as determined by BESE for grade levels and subjects for which value-added data is available. Further requires BESE to establish measures of student growth for grade levels, subjects, and personnel for which value-added data is not available.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but changes the implementation date of the value-added assessment model to be used in teacher and administrator evaluation <u>from</u> the beginning of the 2012-2013 school year <u>to</u> the beginning of the 2013-2014 school year.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that for the 2012-2013 school year, notwithstanding any law, rule, or regulation to the contrary, each city, parish, or other local public school board shall be allowed to utilize the personnel evaluation plans and processes as prescribed by each board's policy on the effective date of Act 54 of the 2010 Regular Session of the Louisiana Legislature.
