2 To enact R.S. 9:344(E), relative to visitation rights; to prohibit visitation rights of a family member in certain circumstances; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for 3 4 related matters. 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: Section 1. R.S. 9:344(E) is hereby enacted to read as follows: 6 7 §344. Visitation rights of grandparents and siblings 8 9 E. The court shall prohibit visitation between a family member and a child, if the court finds by a preponderance of the evidence that the family 10 11 member's criminal conduct resulted in the death of a parent of the child. 12 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 13 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 14 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 15 16 effective on the day following such approval.

## **DIGEST**

Morrell (SB 132)

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the court shall prohibit visitation between a family member and a child, if the court finds by a preponderance of the evidence that the family member's criminal conduct resulted in the death of a parent of the child.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
