SENATE BILL NO. 147

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SCHOOLS. Provides for charter schools to pay a proportionate share of the local school district's of Teachers' Retirement System UAL payment. (6/30/16)

AN ACT

2	To enact R.S. 17:3995(K), relative to charter school funding; to provide for the calculation
3	of the proportionate unfunded accrued liability contribution to the Teachers'
4	Retirement System of Louisiana; to provide for payment of the proportionate
5	contribution; to provide for application of such payment; to provide for an effective
6	date; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 17:3995(K) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
9	§3995. Charter school funding
10	* * *
11	K. According to the Supreme Court of Louisiana in East Baton Rouge
12	Parish School Board, et al. vs. Louisiana School Employees' Retirement System,
13	149 So.3d 244 (2014), writ denied, the state includes in each year's minimum
14	foundation program formula funding the amount necessary for each employer
15	receiving the money to make that year's required contributions to the Teachers'
16	Retirement System of Louisiana, including the normal cost payment, and that

year's payment for amortization of the unfunded accrued liability. In

1	recognition of the court's decision, this Subsection is intended to facilitate the
2	appropriate application of those amounts to the unfunded accrued liability.
3	(1) Between the first and the fifteenth of July of each year, the retirement
4	system shall calculate the total aggregate employer contribution to be applied
5	to the unfunded accrued liability of each public school district in the state for
6	the preceding fiscal year. This sum shall be referred to as the "UAL
7	Contribution".
8	(2) On or before July fifteenth of each year, each public school district
9	shall notify the retirement system of the aggregate total of the state portion of
10	the minimum foundation program formula base per pupil amount, inclusive of
11	Level 1 and Level 2, but not to include any weighted funding, received from the
12	state of Louisiana in the preceding fiscal year. This amount shall be referred to
13	as the "Base MFP".
14	(3) The retirement system shall divide the UAL Contribution by the Base
15	MFP to yield the "UAL Proportion".
16	(4) The retirement system shall notify the Department of Education, by
17	August first of each year, the UAL Proportion for each public school district.
18	(5)(a) The department shall withhold from the base per pupil amount,
19	inclusive of Level 1 and Level 2, but not to include any weighted funding, that
20	would otherwise be provided to each charter school through the minimum
21	foundation program formula, the proportion of such funding equal to the UAL
22	Proportion of the public school district in which the charter school is physically
23	located.
24	(b) For virtual charter schools, the department shall use the UAL
25	Proportion of the public school district which is the home for the highest
26	number of students enrolled in the virtual charter school.
27	(6) The aggregate dollar amount withheld from any charter school's
28	allocation shall be remitted to the retirement system at the same time the net
29	amount of the minimum foundation program funding is transmitted to that

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charter school.

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(7) The retirement system shall apply the funding received in accordance with this Subsection at the same time and in the same manner as all other employer contributions. Section 2. This Act shall become effective on June 30, 2016; if vetoed by the

governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on June 30, 2016, or on the day following such approval by the legislature, whichever is later.

SB 147 Original

Present law provides that charter schools shall receive per pupil funding as provided through the minimum foundation program formula.

Proposed law provides that the Supreme Court of La. has stated that the per pupil funding provided for through the minimum foundation program (MFP) formula includes the contributions to the Teachers' Retirement System of La. (TRSL), both normal cost and that year's payments of the unfunded accrued liability.

Proposed law provides that between the 1st and the 15th of July each year TRSL shall calculate the total aggregate employer contributions to be applied to the unfunded accrued liability of each public school district in the state for the preceding fiscal year. (UAL Contribution)

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that on or before July 15th of each year, each public school district shall notify TRSL of the aggregate total of the state portion of the MFP received from the state. (Base MFP)

Proposed law provides a formula (UAL Contribution divided by the Base MFP) to determine the UAL Proportion.

Proposed law requires TRSL to notify the Department of Education of the UAL Portion for each school district by August 1st of each year.

Proposed law provides that the department shall withhold from per pupil amount that would be provided to each charter school, the portion of such funding equal to the UAL Proportion of the public school district in which the charter school is physically located.

Proposed law provides that for a virtual charter school, the department shall use the UAL Proportion of the public school district which is the home of the highest number of students enrolled in the virtual charter school.

Proposed law provides that the aggregate dollar amount withheld from any charter school's allocation shall be remitted to the retirement system at the same time the net amount of the minimum foundation program funding is transmitted to the charter school.

Proposed law provides that funding received by TRSL in accordance with proposed law shall be applied in the same manner and at the same time as all other employer contributions.
