2	To enact R.S. 15:587.7(A)(3)(c), relative to a volunteer and employee criminal history
3	system; to provide for the definition of individuals; to provide for contractors of
4	qualified entities; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 15:587.7(A)(3)(c) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	§587.7. Volunteer and employee criminal history system
8	A. The Louisiana Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information shall
9	implement a volunteer and employee criminal history system to allow qualified
10	entities to access state and federal criminal history records on certain individuals in
11	the absence of specific statutory provisions regarding access to criminal history
12	record information. For purposes of this Section, the following definitions shall
13	apply:

15	(3) "Individual" means a person who has, seeks to have, or may have access
16	to children, the elderly, or individuals with disabilities, served by a qualified entity
17	who meets either of the following requirements:

SB 161 Original

<u>Present law</u> allows certain businesses and organizations that provide care to children, elderly, or individuals with disabilities to register with the bureau to obtain a state and federal criminal history report on individuals who have or seek to have access to those children, elderly, or individuals with disabilities, to determine their suitability to be providing care to those persons.

Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Present law</u> defines an "individual" as a person who has, seeks to have, or may have access to children, the elderly, or individuals with disabilities, served by a qualified entity as (1) a person employed by or volunteers with, or seeks to be employed by or volunteer with, a qualified entity or (2) a person who owns or operates, or seeks to own or operate, a qualified entity.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds a person who contracts with, or seeks to contract with, a qualified entity to the definition of "individual".

Effective August 1, 2024.
