SENATE BILL NO. 163

BY SENATOR PETERSON

LEGISLATIVE SESSIONS. Provides that general subject, tax, and fiscal matters shall be heard during each regular legislative session. (2/3-CA13s1(A))

1 A JOINT RESOLUTION

2 Proposing to amend Article III, Section 2(A) of the Constitution of Louisiana, to provide  
3 relative to legislative sessions; to limit the length and provide for subject matter of  
4 regular sessions of the legislature; to provide for matters related to the conduct of  
5 such sessions; and to specify an election for submission of the proposition to electors  
6 and provide a ballot proposition.

7 Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members  
8 elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state, for  
9 their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to amend Article III,  
10 Section 2(A) of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows:

11 §2. Sessions

12 Section 2.(A) Annual Session. (1) The legislature shall meet annually in  
13 regular session ~~for a limited number of legislative days~~ in the state capital **for not**  
14 **more than forty-five legislative days during a period of sixty calendar days.** A  
15 legislative day is a calendar day on which either house is in session. **No such**  
16 **session shall continue beyond the sixtieth calendar day after convening. The**  
17 **legislature shall convene at noon on the third Monday in March. No new matter**

1 intended to have the effect of law shall be introduced or received by either house  
2 after six o'clock in the evening of the tenth calendar day. No matter intended  
3 to have the effect of law, except a measure proposing a suspension of law, shall  
4 be considered on third reading and final passage in either house after six o'clock  
5 in the evening of the forty-second legislative day or the fifty-seventh calendar  
6 day, whichever occurs first, except by a favorable record vote of two-thirds of  
7 the elected members of each house.

8 (2)(a) No member of the legislature may introduce more than five bills that  
9 were not prefiled, except as provided in the joint rules of the legislature.

10 (b) Except as provided in Subsubparagraph (c) of this Subparagraph, any bill  
11 that is to be prefiled for introduction in either house shall be prefiled no later than  
12 five o'clock in the evening of the tenth calendar day prior to the first day of a regular  
13 session.

14 (c) Any bill to effect any change in laws relating to any retirement system for  
15 public employees that is to be prefiled for introduction in either house shall be  
16 prefiled no later than five o'clock in the evening of the forty-fifth calendar day prior  
17 to the first day of a regular session.

18 (d) ~~The legislature is authorized to provide by joint rule for the procedures~~  
19 ~~for passage of duplicate or companion instruments.~~

20 (3)(a) ~~All regular sessions convening in even-numbered years shall be general~~  
21 ~~in nature and shall convene at noon on the second Monday in March. The legislature~~  
22 ~~shall meet in such a session for not more than sixty legislative days during a period~~  
23 ~~of eighty-five calendar days. No such session shall continue beyond six o'clock in~~  
24 ~~the evening of the eighty-fifth calendar day after convening. No new matter intended~~  
25 ~~to have the effect of law shall be introduced or received by either house after six~~  
26 ~~o'clock in the evening of the twenty-third calendar day. No matter intended to have~~  
27 ~~the effect of law, except a measure proposing a suspension of law, shall be~~  
28 ~~considered on third reading and final passage in either house after six o'clock in the~~  
29 ~~evening of the fifty-seventh legislative day or the eighty-second calendar day,~~

1           ~~whichever occurs first, except by a favorable record vote of two-thirds of the elected~~

3           ~~(b) No measure levying or authorizing a new tax by the state or by any~~  
4           ~~statewide political subdivision whose boundaries are coterminous with the state;~~  
5           ~~increasing an existing tax by the state or by any statewide political subdivision~~  
6           ~~whose boundaries are coterminous with the state; or legislating with regard to tax~~  
7           ~~exemptions, exclusions, deductions or credits shall be introduced or enacted during~~  
8           ~~a regular session held in an even-numbered year.~~

9           ~~(4)(a) All regular sessions convening in odd-numbered years shall convene~~  
10           ~~at noon on the second Monday in April. The legislature shall meet in such a session~~  
11           ~~for not more than forty-five legislative days in a period of sixty calendar days. No~~  
12           ~~such session shall continue beyond six o'clock in the evening of the sixtieth calendar~~  
13           ~~day after convening. No new matter intended to have the effect of law shall be~~  
14           ~~introduced or received by either house after six o'clock in the evening of the tenth~~  
15           ~~calendar day. No matter intended to have the effect of law, except a measure~~  
16           ~~proposing a suspension of law, shall be considered on third reading and final passage~~  
17           ~~in either house after six o'clock in the evening of the forty-second legislative day or~~  
18           ~~fifty-seventh calendar day, whichever occurs first, except by a favorable record vote~~  
19           ~~of two-thirds of the elected members of each house.~~

20           ~~(b) During any session convening in an odd-numbered year, no matter~~  
21           ~~intended to have the effect of law, including any suspension of law, shall be~~  
22           ~~introduced or considered unless its object is to enact the General Appropriation Bill;~~  
23           ~~enact the comprehensive capital budget; make an appropriation; levy or authorize a~~  
24           ~~new tax; increase an existing tax; levy, authorize, increase, decrease, or repeal a fee;~~  
25           ~~dedicate revenue; legislate with regard to tax exemptions, exclusions, deductions,~~  
26           ~~reductions, repeals, or credits; or legislate with regard to the issuance of bonds. In~~  
27           ~~addition, a matter intended to have the effect of law, including a measure proposing~~  
28           ~~a suspension of law, which is not within the subject matter restrictions provided in~~
