3	<b>C.</b> The sales and use tax shall be imposed by ordinance of the governing
4	authority of the city of Scott and shall be levied upon the sale at retail, the use,
5	lease, or rental, the consumption, and the storage for use or consumption of
6	tangible personal property and on sales of services, all as defined in Chapter
7	2-D of this Subtitle; however, the ordinance imposing the tax shall be adopted
8	only after the proposed tax is approved by a majority of the qualified electors
9	voting on the proposition at an election held for that purpose and conducted in
10	accordance with the Louisiana Election Code.
11	<b>D.</b> The sales and use tax authorized by this Section shall be collected at
12	the same time and in the same manner as set forth in Chapter 2-D of this
13	Subtitle.
14	<b>E.</b> Two-thirds of the proceeds of the tax authorized by this Section shall
15	be used for emergency services provided by the fire and police departments and
16	one-third of the proceeds shall be used for parks and recreations, cultural
17	district, economic development, drainage, roads, and bridges.
18	F. On the official ballot to be used at the election there shall be printed
19	a proposition, upon which the electors of the municipality shall be permitted to
20	vote YES or NO, to adopt the proposition, which proposition shall read as
21	<u>follows:</u>
22	Do you support an additional sales and use tax of (insert
23	amount) percent within the city of Scott, two-thirds of the
24	proceeds which shall be used solely for emergency services
25	provided by the fire and police departments and one-third
26	shall be used solely for parks and recreation, cultural
27	district, economic development, drainage, roads, and
28	bridges?

29	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not

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- 1 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
- 2 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
- 3 effective on the day following such approval.
