WATER/WATERWAYS. Establishes withdrawal limits on the use of groundwater. (8/1/13)

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 30:4(L) and R.S. 38:3097.3(F) and to enact R.S. 30:4(M) and
3	R.S. 38:3097.3(G), relative to water; to provide relative to duties pursuant to Article
4	IX, Section 1 of the Constitution of Louisiana; to establish withdrawal limits on the
5	use of groundwater; to provide certain restrictions; to provide terms, conditions and
6	requirements; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 30:4(L) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 30:4(M) is hereby
9	enacted to read as follows:
10	§4. Jurisdiction, duties, and powers of the assistant secretary; rules and regulations

12	L.(1) Article IX, Section 1 of the Constitution of Louisiana mandates that
13	the legislature shall enact laws to protect, conserve and replenish the natural
14	resources of the state, specifically water. The legislature must ensure that the
15	groundwater of the state is conserved and replenished for future generations.

4	(2)(a) From August 1, 2013, to July 31, 2014, the commissioner shall not
5	authorize, issue or reissue any permit which allows the use or withdrawal of
6	forty million gallons or more of groundwater per day.
7	(b) From August 1, 2014, to July 31, 2015, the commissioner shall not
8	authorize, issue or reissue any permit which allows the use or withdrawal of
9	thirty-five million gallons or more of groundwater per day.
10	(c) From August 1, 2015, to July 31, 2016, the commissioner shall not
11	authorize, issue or reissue any permit which allows the use or withdrawal of
12	thirty million gallons or more of groundwater per day.
13	(d) From August 1, 2016, to July 31, 2017, the commissioner shall not
14	authorize, issue or reissue any permit which allows the use or withdrawal of
15	twenty-five million gallons or more of groundwater per day.
16	(e) Beginning August 1, 2017, the commissioner shall not authorize, issue
17	or reissue any permit which allows the use or withdrawal of twenty million
18	gallons or more of groundwater per day.
19	(3) The provisions of Paragraph (L)(2) of this Section shall not apply to
20	agricultural or residential uses.
21	$\underline{\mathbf{M}}_{\bullet}$ (1) The commissioner shall make, after notice and hearings as provided
22	in this Chapter, any reasonable rules, regulations, and orders that are necessary to
23	require the operator of a well, which utilizes the application of fluids with force or
24	pressure in order to create artificial fractures in the formation for the purpose of
25	improving the capacity to produce hydrocarbons, to report no later than twenty days
26	following the completion of hydraulic fracturing stimulation operations and in a
27	manner determined by the commissioner the following:

4	F.(1) Article IX, Section 1 of the Constitution of Louisiana mandates that

13	(2)(a) From August 1, 2013, to July 31, 2014, the commissioner shall not
14	authorize, issue or reissue any permit which allows the use or withdrawal of
15	forty million gallons or more of groundwater per day.
16	(b) From August 1, 2014, to July 31, 2015, the commissioner shall not
17	authorize, issue or reissue any permit which allows the use or withdrawal of
18	thirty-five million gallons or more of groundwater per day.
19	(c) From August 1, 2015, to July 31, 2016, the commissioner shall not
20	authorize, issue or reissue any permit which allows the use or withdrawal of
21	thirty million gallons or more of groundwater per day.
22	(d) From August 1, 2016, to July 31, 2017, the commissioner shall not
23	authorize, issue or reissue any permit which allows the use or withdrawal of
24	twenty-five million gallons or more of groundwater per day.
25	(e) Beginning August 1, 2017, the commissioner shall not authorize, issue
26	or reissue any permit which allows the use or withdrawal of twenty million
27	gallons or more of groundwater per day.
28	(3) The provisions of Paragraph (F)(2) of this Section shall not apply to
29	agricultural or residential uses.

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<u>G.</u>(1) The commissioner, upon determining that a violation of Chapters 13-A, 13-A-1, or 13-B of this Title or the regulations adopted thereunder has occurred, may impose a civil penalty as provided in this Chapter. Additionally, upon determining that a violation of Chapters 13-A, 13-A-1, or 13-B of this Title or the rules and regulations made pursuant to Chapters 13-A, 13-A-1, or 13-B of this Title has occurred, the commissioner may issue an order requiring compliance. Any such order shall state, with reasonable specificity, the nature of the violation, any cessation of activities or affirmative operations required to achieve compliance, and a time limit within which compliance with the order must be achieved. Noncompliance with any such order to comply shall constitute a violation of Chapters 13-A, 13-A-1, or 13-B of this Title, and the commissioner may impose a civil penalty for such violation. Any person subjected to a civil penalty shall have the right to a public hearing if requested in writing, which written request shall suspend the imposition of penalty until final action is taken by the commissioner.

## **DIGEST**

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for certain groundwater restrictions as follows:

- (1) From August 1, 2013, to July 31, 2014, the commissioner must not authorize, issue or re-issue any permit which allows the use or withdrawal of 40 million gallons or more of groundwater per day.
- (2) From August 1, 2014, to July 31, 2015, the commissioner must not authorize, issue or re-issue any permit which allows the use or withdrawal of 35 million gallons or more of groundwater per day.
- (3) From August 1, 2015, to July 31, 2016, the commissioner must not authorize, issue or re-issue any permit which allows the use or withdrawal of 30 million gallons or more of groundwater per day.
- (4) From August 1, 2016, to July 31, 2017, the commissioner must not authorize, issue or re-issue any permit which allows the use or withdrawal of 25 million gallons or more of groundwater per day.
- (5) Beginning August 1, 2017, the commissioner must not authorize, issue or re-issue any permit which allows the use or withdrawal of 20 million gallons or more of groundwater per day.

Proposed law exempts agricultural or residential uses from proposed law.

Effective August 1, 2013.
