SENATE BILL NO. 219

BY SENATORS MILLS AND MARIONNEAUX

TAX EXEMPTIONS. Creates the Acadiana Cultural and Entertainment Special District and authorizes certain parishes within the district to provide an exemption from their sales tax for purchases by a motion picture production company for a specific state-certified movie production by that company. (gov sig)

1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 47:337.11.2, relative to exemption from the sales and use taxes of political
3	subdivisions; to create the Acadiana Cultural and Entertainment Special District and
4	authorize certain parishes within the district to provide a certain exemption from
5	their sales and use taxes; and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 47:337.11.2 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
8	§337.11.2. Acadiana Cultural and Entertainment Special District; optional
9	exemption
10	A. The Legislature of the State of Louisiana hereby finds that motion
11	picture production generated by Louisiana Motion Picture Investor Tax Credits
12	has been a benefit for the state. The Louisiana Entertainment 2011 Economic
13	Impact Study estimates that over the course of the three years covered in the
14	study motion picture productions will have spent approximately one hundred
15	five billion dollars in Louisiana. To date, the typical production is spending
16	eighty percent of its budget in the state - and even blockbuster size films with
17	budgets in excess of twenty million dollars spend fifty percent. And these

1	percentages have steadily increased. From 2008 to 2010, productions averaged
2	ninety-two per year. However, the legislature also finds that, unfortunately, the
3	productions, and therefore their spin-off economic benefits, have tended to be
4	focused in certain regions of the state. Many areas have received far less movie-
5	making activity than others. Therefore, it is the determination and intention of
6	the legislature in enacting this Act to provide another tax incentive tool to
7	induce the location of movie picture production in some of those heretofore
8	neglected areas.
9	B. There is hereby created the Acadiana Cultural and Entertainment
10	Special District composed of all the parishes with the following populations
11	according to the latest federal decennial census:
12	(1) Any parish with a population between 50,000 and 52,250.
13	(2) Any parish with a population between 56,000 and 90,000.
14	(3) Any parish with a population between 200,000 and 230,000.
15	C. Any taxing authority within any parish in the ACES District may
16	provide for an exemption from their sales and use tax for the sales, purchases,
17	or leases and rentals by a motion picture production company for a specific
18	state-certified production by that company, all as set forth in the instrument,
19	resolution, vote, or other affirmative action providing the exemption. A separate
20	action providing an exemption shall be necessary for each state-certified
21	production granted the exemption.
22	D. For purposes of this Section, the following words and terms shall have
23	the following meanings:
24	(1) "ACES District" means the Acadiana Cultural and Entertainment
25	Special District.
26	(2) "Motion picture production company" shall have the same meaning
27	<u>as provided for in R.S. 47:6007(B)(6).</u>
28	(3) "State-certified production" means a production approved for
29	Louisiana Motion Picture Investor Tax Credits by the office of entertainment

2	E. The exemption provided for in this Section shall not be granted on any
3	tax in effect on the date of the grant which secures bonds if the grant will affect
4	or impair the security of such bonds.
5	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
6	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
7	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
8	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
9	effective on the day following such approval.

DIGEST

<u>Proposed law</u> creates the Acadiana Cultural and Entertainment Special District composed of all the parishes with the following populations according to the latest federal decennial census:

- (1) Any parish with a population between 50,000 and 52,250.
- (2) Any parish with a population between 56,000 and 90,000.
- (3) Any parish with a population between 200,000 and 230,000.

Authorizes any taxing authority within any parish within the district to provide for an exemption from their sales tax for the sales, purchases, or leases and rentals by a "motion picture production company" for a specific "state-certified production" by that company, all as set forth in the instrument, resolution, vote, or other affirmative action providing the exemption. A separate action providing an exemption is required for each state-certified production granted the exemption.

"Motion picture production company" has the same meaning as is provided in the Louisiana Motion Picture Investor Tax Credits law, R.S. 47:6007(B)(6). "State-certified production" also is defined as a production approved by the office of entertainment industry development in the Department of Economic Development for the credits.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits granting the exemption for any tax in effect on the date of the grant which secures bonds if the grant will affect or impair the security of such bonds.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
