CONSUMERS/PROTECTION. Creates the Customer Security Act. (8/1/18)


#### Abstract

AN ACT To enact Chapter 58 of Title 51 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 51:3151, relative to businesses; to require businesses that accept utility payments in cash to ensure the premises are safe; to provide for certain terms and conditions; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: Section 1. Chapter 58 of Title 51 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 51:3151, is hereby enacted to read as follows:

\section*{CHAPTER 58. CUSTOMER SECURITY ACT} §3151. Utility payment processing at businesses; security A. This Section shall be known and may be cited as the "Customer

Security Act". B. All businesses, including but not limited to a grocery store or retail establishment, that allow utility payments to be made in cash on its premises shall take all reasonable and necessary steps to ensure the premises are safe for the customer to make such payments.
