6	Section 1. Code of Civil Procedure Art. 192.2(B) is hereby amended and reenacted

8	Art. 192.2. Appointment of interpreter for non-English-speaking persons

10	B. The court shall order payment to the interpreter for his services at a fixed
11	reasonable amount, and that amount shall be paid out of the appropriate court fund,
12	except as provided in Paragraph C of this Article. The amount paid out of the fund
13	may be taxed by the court as costs of court to be reimbursed to the fund.

15	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
16	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
17	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If

DIGEST SB 249 Original 2020 Regular Session

<u>Present law</u> requires the court to order payment out of the court fund to the interpreter for his services at a fixed reasonable amount in civil proceedings.

<u>Present law</u> specifies that the amount paid out of the court fund may be taxed by the court as costs of court to be reimbursed to the fund.

<u>Proposed law</u> eliminates the authorization that the amount paid out of the court fund to the interpreter be taxed by the court as costs of court to be reimbursed to the fund.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
